## Colorado Smoke Management Program - Priorities For winter 2012-2013 Colorado Air Pollution Control Division

[Note to external readers: This is a list of priorities, not necessarily of expected accomplishments. We write out a longer list than we expect to complete. In past half-years we've got half to two-thirds of the way down lists like this one.]

- 1. Respond to legal requests related to Lower North Fork fire as required.
- 2. Review permit applications and revision requests in  $\leq$  30 days, including internal committee review of non-standard applications.
- 3. Finalize memo defining agricultural burning.
- 4. Track proposed legislation that may affect the smoke program, and respond as needed.
- 5. Manage annual accomplishment reporting.
  - a. Prepare 2011 program report
  - b. For 2012 actuals, post drafts, track completions, and clean data as needed.
- 6. Host January semi-annual stakeholder meeting.
- 7. Work with USFS, The Nature Conservancy, and any other interested stakeholder group on a modeling workshop.
- 8. Make progress implementing a community-based pilot project initiative.
- 9. Website:
  - a. Make on-going updates and improvements such as newsletter items.
  - b. Update and try to simplify some website documents, such as some of the policy statements and/or sets of examples.
- 10. Update program overview one-pager.
- 11. Support the National Park Service and Fort Carson in preparing for significant user update hearings in early 2013.
- 12. Start clean-up of Regulation 9 language.
  - a. With the open burn program, make a list of proposed changes.
  - b. Discuss process with Air Commission staff.
  - c. Initiate executive order process to offer involvement to local governments, required for all regulation changes.

- 13. Make site visits & inspections, with reports, for 50%(+) of priority 1 and 2 burn days and/or people.
- 14. On-line reporting:
  - a. Continue to explore hosting options, focusing on external providers.
  - b. Switch our database to SQL
- 15. Set up mechanism to monitor revenue collection & minimize inappropriate diversions to collections.
