**Summary of National and State Performance Measures**

**National Performance Measure 1**

*The percent of infants who are screened for conditions mandated by their State-sponsored newborn screening programs (e.g. phenylketonuria and hemoglobinopathies) and receive appropriate follow up as defined by their State.*

**National Performance Measure 2**

*The percent of children with special health care needs age 0 to 18 years whose families partner in decision making at all levels and are satisfied with the services they receive.*

**National Performance Measure 3**

*The percent of children with special health care needs age 0 through 18 who receive coordinated, ongoing, comprehensive care within a medical home.*

**National Performance Measure 4**

*The percent of children with special health care needs age 0 to 18 whose families have adequate private and/or public insurance to pay for the services they need.*

**National Performance Measure 5**

*Percent of children with special health care needs age 0 to 18 whose families report the community-based service systems are organized so they can use them easily.*

**National Performance Measure 6**

*The percentage of youth with special health care needs who received the services necessary to make a transition to all aspects of adult life*

**National Performance Measure 7**

*Percent of children through age 2 who have completed immunizations for measles, mumps, rubella, polio, diphtheria, tetanus, pertussis, hemophilus influenza, and hepatitis B*

**National Performance Measure 8**

*The rate of birth (per 1,000) for teenagers aged 15 through 17 years*

**National Performance Measure 9**

*Percent of third grade children who have received protective sealants on at least one permanent molar tooth*

**National Performance Measure 10**

*The rate of deaths to children aged 0-14 caused by motor vehicle crashes per 100,000 children*

**National Performance Measure 11**

*Percentage of mothers who breastfeed their infants at hospital discharge*

**National Performance Measure 12**

*Percentage of newborns who have been screened for hearing impairment before hospital discharge*

**National Performance Measure 13**

*Percent of children without health insurance.*

**National Performance Measure 14**

*Percent of potentially Medicaid-eligible children who have received a service paid by the Medicaid Program.*

**National Performance Measure 15**

*Percent of very low birth weight live births*

**National Performance Measure 16**

*The rate (per 100,000) of suicide deaths among youths age 15-19*

**National Performance Measure 17**

*Percent of very low birth weight infants delivered at facilities for high-risk deliveries and neonates*

**National Performance Measure 18**

*Percent of infants born to pregnant women receiving prenatal care beginning in the first trimester*

*(Total of 10 State Performance Measures, below numbering system reflects current measures)*

**State Performance Measure 1**

*The proportion of high school students reporting having drunk alcohol in the past month*

**State Performance Measure 2**

*The proportion of all pregnancies that are unintended*

**State Performance Measure 3**

*The incidence of maltreatment of children younger than 18 (including physical abuse, sexual abuse, emotional abuse, and/or neglect)*

**State Performance Measure 6**

*The proportion of high school students reporting regular use of tobacco products*

**State Performance Measure 7**

*The proportion of children and adolescents attending public schools who have access to research-based health education and to basic preventive and primary, physical and behavioral health services through school-based health centers*

**State Performance Measure 8**

*Percent of Medicaid-eligible children who receive dental services as part of their comprehensive services*

**State Performance Measure 10**

*The rate of homicides among teens 15-19*

**State Performance Measure 12**

*Maintain or reduce the proportion of WIC children who are overweight*

**State Performance Measure 13**

*Reduce the percentage of women with inadequate weight gain during pregnancy*

**State Performance Measure 14**

*Reduce the rate of injury hospitalization among children 19 and younger*
