STATE RCRA PERMIT
CLEAN HARBORS DEER TRAIL, LLC.

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Pursuant to the Colorado Hazardous Waste Act, §§ 25-15-301 to 316, C.R.S., hereafter called "the Act", and the implementing regulations promulgated thereunder by the Colorado Board of Health and the Hazardous Waste Commission, 6 CCR 1007-3, and 6 CCR 1007-2, a permit is issued to Clean Harbors Deer Trail, LLC. (hereafter called "the Permittee"), to operate a hazardous waste storage, treatment and disposal facility located in Adams County, at 108555 East Highway 36.

The Permittee must comply with all terms and conditions of this permit. This permit consists of the conditions contained herein (including those in any attachments) and the applicable regulations contained in 6 CCR 1007-3. Applicable regulations are those, which are in effect on the date of issuance of this permit.

This permit is based on the assumption that the information submitted in the permit application attached to the Permittee's letter dated October 14, 2004, modified by subsequent amendments dated August 2, 2005 and information provided by the applicant during public involvement meetings and during the drafting of the Permit, (hereafter referred to as the application), is accurate.

Any inaccuracies found in the submitted information may be grounds for the termination, revocation and reissuance, or modification of this permit in accordance with 6 CCR 1007-3, Section 100.6 and for potential enforcement action. The Permittee must inform the Colorado Department of Public Health & Environment (CDPHE) of any deviation from or changes in the information in the application, which would affect the Permittee's ability to comply with the applicable regulations or permit conditions.

U.S. Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) will retain enforcement authority for the Parts of the Permit dealing with Phase II through Phase IV of 6 CCR 1007-3, Part 268 - Land Disposal Restrictions until CDPHE receives authority for these Parts, or CDPHE enters into a Memorandum of Agreement with EPA to implement these portions of the program. Once authorized via one of these mechanisms, the State of Colorado will assume enforcement authority for these parts of the Permit.

This permit is effective as of 1/20/06 , (30 days after issuance) and shall remain in effect until 1/20/11 , (5 year duration) unless revoked and reissued, or terminated under 6 CCR 1007-3, Section 100.61.
