

In 2007 the Dome's interior observation area reopened along with Mr. Brown's Attic. This exhibit, named after Henry Cordes Brown, who donated the capitol grounds, is home to nearly 100 Capitol photographs, maps, memorabilia, and interactive displays. It is an integral piece of the capitol's education and tour program. It is frequented by scheduled student and adult tour groups and walk-in visitors. More than 50,000 visitors annually visit Mr. Brown's Attic, and when the dome reopens in 2014, it is anticipated that the number of visitors will increase. Due to the high volume of traffic and age of the exhibit, an annual maintenance budget of \$1,500.00 was established to repair and replace exhibit items.
