Description: The committee is composed of:

- the executive director of the Department of Local Affairs;
- the executive director of the Department of Natural Resources;
- the Commissioner of Education;
- the executive director of the Department of Public Health and Environment;
- the executive director of the Department of Transportation; and
- seven residents of areas impacted by energy conversion or mineral resource development appointed by the Governor, with the consent of the Senate, for terms not exceeding four years to serve at the pleasure of the Governor.

The executive director of the Department of Local Affairs acts as chairperson of the committee. Members of the committee shall serve without additional compensation; except that the seven members appointed from energy impact areas shall be entitled to reimbursement for actual and necessary expenses. Any member of the committee who is a state official may designate representatives of his or her agency to serve on the committee in his or her absence. The chairperson shall convene the advisory committee from time to time as he or she deems necessary.

The advisory committee continuously reviews the existing and potential impact of the development, processing, or energy conversion of mineral and fuel resources on various areas of the state, including those areas indirectly affected, and makes continuing recommendations to the Department of Local Affairs, including, but not limited to, those actions deemed reasonably necessary and practicable to assist impacted areas with the problems occasioned by development, processing, or energy conversion, the immediate and projected problems which the local governments are experiencing in providing governmental services, the extent of local tax resources available to each unit of local government, the extent of local tax effort in solving energy impacted problems, and other problems that the areas have experienced, such as housing and environmental considerations, which have developed as a direct result of energy impact. The committee is charged with making continuing specific recommendations regarding any

discretionary distributions by the executive director of the Department of Local Affairs of severance tax moneys and federal mineral lease moneys.


