

State Revenue

This bill will not affect overall state revenue, but it redirects moneys collected from civil penalties for petroleum tank violations from the Petroleum Storage Tank Fund to the redevelopment fund. Fines collected and deposited into the Petroleum Storage Tank Fund currently amount to approximately \$25,000 to \$75,000 per year.

State Transfers

For FY 2013-14, this bill transfers \$5,000,000 from the Petroleum Cleanup and Redevelopment Fund to the State Highway Fund. It cannot be determined whether sufficient funds will be available for this transfer.

State Expenditures

For FY 2013-14, this bill is expected to increase state expenditures by \$5,006,566, cash funds. This bill provides \$5,000,000 for the Department of Transportation to install a fire suppression system at the Eisenhower-Johnson tunnels. Although not specifically directed by this bill, this fiscal note assumes payment for this system will occur in FY 2013-14.

In addition, this bill requires the Department of Labor and Employment (CDLE) to promulgate rules associated with the activity of the redevelopment fund. The bill also requires attorney review of submitted applications for determination of consistency with these rules. These costs are estimated at \$6,566 for FY 2013-14 and \$7,725 for FY 2014-15 and beyond.

State Appropriations

For FY 2013-14, the CDLE requires an appropriation \$6,566, from the Petroleum Storage Tank Fund, which should be reappropriated to the Department of Law.

The State Highway Fund is continuously appropriated to the Department of Transportation.
