Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes a provision that appropriates \$18,944 for computer programming rather than \$15,984 as outlined in the State Expenditures table on page 3 of the Legislative Council Staff Revised Fiscal Note. The appropriations clause appropriates a total of 2.0 FTE and \$149,313 cash funds from the Division of Professions and Occupations Cash Fund to the Department of Regulatory Agencies and reappropriates \$7,725 to the Department of Law for FY 2013-14.

Description of Amendments in This Packet

J.005 Staff has prepared amendment **J.005** (attached) to change the existing clause to appropriate \$15,984 for computer programming and a total of \$146,353 cash funds from the Division of Professions and Occupations Cash Fund to the Department of Regulatory Agencies for FY 2013-14.
