**Summary of Legislation**

This bill removes the requirement that the director of the Colorado Bureau of Investigation (CBI) be certified by the Peace Officers Standards and Training (P.O.S.T.) board.

**State Revenue and Expenditures**

**This bill will not significantly impact state revenues or expenditures.** It may, however alleviate the need for one P.O.S.T. exam, which may have otherwise been submitted if this requirement remained in effect. Each exam increases state revenue by \$125. It is also plausible that the CBI would select a P.O.S.T. certified director who had previously taken the exam, instead of a non-certified director, thus creating no fiscal impact from this bill.
