Summary of Legislation

This bill, as recommended by the *Wildfire Matters Review Committee*, expands the authority of county governments to regulate fires. Under the bill, counties may ban or restrict agricultural burning on "red flag" days, when red flag warning or fire weather watches have been issued by the National Weather Service. The bill also authorizes counties to regulate fireworks at all times of year, amending existing statute that generally prohibits counties from enforcing regulations concerning the sale, use, and possession of fireworks between May 31 and July 5 of each year.

Local Government Impact

The bill increases county government expenditures. For county governments that adopt legislation addressing agricultural burns or seasonal fireworks sales between May 31 and July 5, costs may increase to implement such legislation. Costs, if any, may include processing agricultural burn permits or conducting law enforcement activities. Such implementation costs will vary between jurisdictions and depend on the specific content of the county resolution or ordinance.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect upon signature of the Governor, or upon becoming law without his signature.
