Summary of Legislation

This bill requires a person who publishes booking photographs or other basic identification information on a commercial website to remove such information upon the request of a person who is not charged, whose charges are dismissed, or who is acquitted of the charges. The publisher must comply within 30 days of receiving a written request and remove the information without compensation. The requester may file a civil action to recover damages if the publisher does not comply.

State Revenue and Expenditures

Beginning in FY 2014-15, this bill could increase caseload in trial courts under the Judicial Department by a minimal amount. Any such increase would be the result of civil actions filed as a result of failure to comply with the new requirements. To the extent court filings increase, revenue to the Judicial Stabilization Cash Fund will also increase by a minimal amount. The fiscal note assumes any additional revenue and workload will be minimal and not require an increase in appropriations.

Local Government Impact

If a requester initiates a civil action in Denver County Court, revenue and workload for the City and County of Denver will also increase by a minimal amount. The fiscal note assumes any such increase in civil filings will be minimal.

Effective Date

The bill takes effect August 6, 2014, if the General Assembly adjourns on May 7, 2014, as scheduled, and no referendum petition is filed.
