The House Judiciary Committee Report (02/03/15) increases from 10 percent to 12 percent the amount of moneys in the Crime Victim Compensation Fund that district attorneys may retain and use for administrative costs. Should district attorneys choose to increase the amount that they retain for administrative costs, it will reduce the amount available for compensation of crime victims. However, Legislative Council Staff and JBC Staff agree that the committee amendments do not change the fiscal impact of the bill concerning state expenditures or state revenues.
