Current Appropriations Clause in Bill

The bill includes an appropriation clause that provides \$23,736 General Fund to the Department of Public Health and Environment for FY 2015-16. This provision also states that the appropriation is based on the assumption that the Department will require an additional 0.4 FTE.

Points to Consider

General Fund Impact

The Joint Budget Committee has proposed a budget package for FY 2015-16 based on the March 2015 Legislative Council Staff revenue forecast. The budget package allocates a total of \$18.5 million General Fund to be available to fund 2015 legislation. If the full \$18.5 million is not used to fund legislation, it will remain in the General Fund reserve.
