A BILL FOR AN ACT

101 **CONCERNING THE CONSIDERATION OF RESIDENCY IN PERFORMANCE**

102 **METRICS IN HIGHER EDUCATION FEE-FOR-SERVICE CONTRACTS.**

Bill Summary

Fee-for-service contracts awarded to state institutions of higher education (institutions) include amounts based upon the performance of the institution. The bill requires the Colorado commission on higher education to measure and apply performance metrics to institutions based upon the performance of the institution's resident undergraduate students. However, the bill permits the fee-for-service contract to include an

amount for resident and nonresident master's or doctoral degrees awarded by the institution.

1 *Be it enacted by the General Assembly of the State of Colorado:*

2 **SECTION 1.** In Colorado Revised Statutes, 23-18-303, **add** (9)
3 as follows:

4 **23-18-303. Fee-for-service contracts - authorization -**
5 **definitions.** (9) AN INSTITUTION SHALL NOT USE PERFORMANCE FUNDING
6 RECEIVED PURSUANT TO THIS SECTION FOR DIRECT FINANCIAL SUPPORT
7 FOR ANY NONRESIDENT STUDENT.

8 **SECTION 2. Safety clause.** The general assembly hereby finds,
9 determines, and declares that this act is necessary for the immediate
10 preservation of the public peace, health, and safety.
