State Offers Taxpayers New Electronic Payment Option

Denver, CO - Colorado taxpayers now have another option when it comes to paying their Colorado State income taxes thanks to a new service developed by the Department of Revenue and Colorado.gov. Now, individuals filing their tax returns via the Colorado NetFile online tax filing system can pay taxes owed to the state electronically using a Visa, MasterCard or electronic check.

This electronic payment service is available to any taxpayer who wants to pay their individual income taxes filed using the State of Colorado's NetFile tax filing system. To make an electronic payment, users simply complete their filing via the NetFile system and select the online payment link. The user then provides basic information to enable their payment and submits the transaction. All payments are processed by Colorado.gov's secure payment processing software and can be made using a credit card or electronic check. In most cases, the payment information is processed by the Department of Revenue and applied to the taxpayer's account within 24 hours.

"This streamlined tax filing and payment option is another example of our commitment to using the latest technology to make interacting with state government more convenient," said Governor Bill Ritter. "We continue to be diligent with our efforts at providing efficient and effective services to the citizens of Colorado."

The service is currently available to taxpayers who owe money for individual income taxes. The Department of Revenue intends to expand the service throughout 2007 to include additional tax types.

"The Department of Revenue is very excited to offer the convenience of electronic payment coupled with the online filing option," said Roxy Huber, Executive Director of the Colorado Department of Revenue. "With the introduction of this feature, taxpayers can now file and pay their state income taxes in one easy step. By streamlining this process, both Colorado taxpayers and the Department can realize tremendous time savings."
