## Four More Counties Put Car Tag Renewals Online

Residents of Boulder, El Paso, Jefferson, and Pueblo County can now enjoy the convenience of renewing their vehicle registration online. This service, the first-of-its-kind in Colorado, allows vehicle owners with an eligible vehicle that is registered in any of the participating counties to renew their registration quickly and easily via the Internet.

First introduced in Douglas and Denver counties in December of last year, the Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service has given residents yet another convenient alternative when it comes to renewing their registration. To use the service, vehicle owners need only enter their license plate number. The system then verifies that the vehicle meets minimum eligibility requirements and that the owner has up to date insurance and emissions information on file with the county. Once confirmed, the online portion of the vehicle registration renewal can be completed within a matter of minutes.

"The state is using this unique online system to provide convenient, user-friendly services to the public," said Gov. Bill Ritter. "This latest technology is part of our larger plan to improve services to the public while improving efficiencies within state government."

The goal of the Division of Motor Vehicles, in partnership with participating counties, is to expand the Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service throughout the state of Colorado. Currently, a total of six counties offer the Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service and additional counties are scheduled to adopt the program over the summer.

"The Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service is a great success," commented Roxy Huber, Executive Director of the Colorado Department of Revenue. "We are very excited to offer more residents the ability to renew their vehicle registrations online with the added convenience of being able to pay the renewal fee using a credit card or electronic check". In addition, the online renewal service benefits the counties by reducing paperwork and shortening lines in county motor vehicle offices.
