## Get Out Of Line in Six More Colorado Counties

### *Fifteen Counties Now Offer Online Vehicle Registration Renewals*

Residents of Eagle, Gilpin, Grand, Logan, Mesa, and Weld counties can now enjoy the convenience of renewing their vehicle registrations online, thanks to the Colorado Department of Revenue, in conjunction with Colorado.gov, the state web portal. With the addition of these six counties, a total of fifteen counties in Colorado currently offer the Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service to their residents.

This "first-of-its-kind" service in Colorado, allows vehicle owners with an eligible vehicle that is registered in any of the participating counties to renew their registration quickly and easily via the Internet. Since the service was first introduced in Douglas and Denver counties in December of last year, thousands of residents have found it to be a quick and convenient alternative for renewing their registration. To use the service, vehicle owners need only to enter their license plate number. The system verifies that the vehicle meets eligibility requirements and that the owner has up to date insurance and emissions information on file with the county and state. Once confirmed, the online portion of the vehicle registration renewal can be completed within a matter of minutes.

"This unique online service demonstrates the state's commitment to providing convenient, user-friendly, progressive services to the public," said Gov. Bill Ritter. "More than 2.5 million registered vehicles are now potentially eligible for the online registration option—a convenient, fast, and efficient alternative to the old paper process. This latest technology fits our overall strategy to increase automated services to the public while improving efficiencies within state government."

The goal of the Division of Motor Vehicles, in partnership with participating counties, is to expand the Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service throughout the state of Colorado. Additional counties are scheduled to adopt the program in the coming year.

"To date, more than 90,000 plates have been processed online with the Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service," said Roxy Huber, Executive Director of the Colorado Department of Revenue. "The success of this service is very evident for residents and counties alike. Residents can submit and pay for renewals using either a credit card or eCheck. Counties benefit by seeing a reduction in paperwork and shorter lines in county motor vehicle offices."

The vehicle owners within Eagle, Gilpin, Grand, Logan, Mesa, and Weld counties, along with Douglas, Denver, Boulder, El Paso, Jefferson, Pueblo, Arapahoe, Larimer, and Routt counties, can access the service at [www.Colorado.gov/renewplates](http://www.Colorado.gov/renewplates).
