### **Motor Vehicle Division Pilots New Online Vehicle Registration Renewal Service in Denver and Douglas Counties**

No time in your busy day to run errands, but need to renew your vehicle registration right away? Renewing vehicle registrations has never been easier, thanks to an enhanced online vehicle registration renewal service implemented recently by the Colorado Department of Revenue, Division of Motor Vehicles, in collaboration with the state Web portal, Colorado.gov.

"This partnership brings a new level of ease and convenience to the vehicle registration renewal process," said Governor Bill Owens. "The state is using the latest technology to provide convenient, user-friendly services to the public. Renewing vehicle registrations has never been easier."

In the past year, there were approximately 4.6 million vehicles registered in the state of Colorado. To enhance convenience and provide greater customer service to vehicle owners, the new Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service was recently piloted in Douglas and Denver Counties.

"With Colorado's steady growth, we're always trying to find ways to manage our business load without adding more staff, and online renewals help with that goal," commented Carole Murray, Douglas County Clerk and Recorder. "Being among the first to pilot the exciting new Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service is great for Douglas County and its vehicle owners," added Jack Arrowsmith, Douglas County Clerk and Recorder elect.

"We're very excited about the potential of this program to save countless hours of time for Denver vehicle owners by streamlining this important service," said Denver Mayor John Hickenlooper. "Online renewal of motor vehicle registrations is more efficient for a great many Denver drivers as well as for City Motor Vehicle Division staff, and it is more cost-effective for all Denver taxpayers."

The goal of the Division of Motor Vehicles is to eventually extend the reach of the Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service to all Colorado counties as they are converted to the new CSTARs (Colorado State Tilting and Registration System) backend database.

"The Department of Revenue is very excited about piloting the Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service to the citizens in Douglas and Denver Counties," commented M. Michael Cooke, Executive Director of the Colorado Department of Revenue. "Eventually, this new service will be accessible to all Colorado vehicle owners, enabling them to renew their vehicle registrations more efficiently and effectively, while following the state's vehicle renewal registration guidelines."
