Get Out Of Line in Arapahoe, Larimer, and Routt Counties

Car Tag Renewals Are Now Online in 9 Counties

With the recent surge in gas prices, why waste your time and money driving to the DMV to renew your plates? Residents of Arapahoe, Larimer, and Routt Counties can now enjoy the convenience of renewing their vehicle registration online. This brings the total to nine counties in Colorado that offer their residents online vehicle registration renewal.

This "first-of-its-kind" service in Colorado, allows vehicle owners with an eligible vehicle that is registered in any of the participating counties to renew their registration quickly and easily via the Internet. First introduced in Douglas and Denver counties in December of last year, numerous residents are finding the Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service to be a convenient alternative for renewing their registration. To use the service, vehicle owners need only enter their license plate number. The system then automatically verifies that the vehicle meets minimum eligibility requirements and that the owner has up to date insurance and emissions information on file with the county. Once confirmed, the online portion of the vehicle registration renewal can be completed within a matter of minutes.

"This unique online service demonstrates how the state is attempting to provide convenient, user-friendly and modern services to the public," said Gov. Bill Ritter. "More than 2.5 million registered vehicles are now potentially eligible for the online registration option, a convenient, fast, and efficient alternative to the old paper process. This latest technology is part of our larger plan to enhance services to the public while improving efficiencies within state government."

The goal of the Division of Motor Vehicles, in partnership with participating counties, is to expand the Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service throughout the state of Colorado. Additional counties are scheduled to adopt the program throughout the year.

"Since the launch of the Online Vehicle Registration Renewal service, there have been approximately 22,900 plates renewed online," said Roxy Huber, Executive Director of the Colorado Department of Revenue. "This service has proven to be a great success. We are very excited to offer more residents the ability to renew their vehicle registrations online with the added convenience of paying the renewal fee using a credit card or electronic check. This online service has also benefited the counties by reducing paperwork and shortening lines in county motor vehicle offices."

Arapahoe, Larimer, and Routt County vehicle owners, along with Douglas, Denver, Boulder, El Paso, Jefferson, and Pueblo Counties, can access the service at www.Colorado.gov/renewplates.
