**FISCAL YEAR 2008-2009 COMPREHENSIVE PRIMARY & PREVENTIVE CARE (CPPC)
GRANT AWARD ANNOUNCEMENT**

The Department of Health Care Policy and Financing is pleased to announce that it has awarded funding to seven health care providers for a total \$2,268,786. The Comprehensive Primary and Preventive Care Grant Program (CPPC) provides grants to health care providers in order to expand primary and preventive health care services to Colorado's low-income residents.

The following health care providers will receive new CPPC funding for 2008-2009:

Approximately \$800,000 has also been designated in 2008-2009 for continued funding of multi-year CPPC grants awarded in 2006-2007 and in 2007-2008. These awards are unaffected by the new awards listed above.

Actual funding to be awarded to each provider is contingent on contract negotiations between the provider and the Department. If more funding becomes available, additional awards may be issued at a later date.

Since the first CPPC grant awards were made in April 2001, approximately \$26.9 million has been disbursed to health care providers. This funding has succeeded in providing medical, dental, mental health and pharmaceutical services to at least 122,746 patients in 273,172 encounters. CPPC grant awards have also made funding available for 31 construction/remodeling projects that resulted in additional or updated facilities.
