AUTHORITY FOR REGISTRATION:

Title 35, Article 12, CRS -- Each commercial fertilizer, soil conditioner and/or plant amendment product must be registered by the person whose name appears on the label before being distributed into or used in the State of Colorado.

REGISTRATION FEE: \$40.00 per product.

INSTRUCTIONS:

1. List company name, address, telephone numbers, e-mail address and product/brand information.
2. *Send completed application, registration fee(s) and label(s) for all soil conditioners and/or plant amendments listed on this application to:*

3. The Department of Agriculture may require proof for claims made on the label for any soil conditioner and/or plant amendment. This may include proof of usefulness and value of the product. As evidence of proof, the Department will rely on experimental data, evaluations or advice supplied from such sources as Colorado State University. The experimental design shall be related to conditions in Colorado. Other sources of proof as evidence in evaluating soil conditioners and/or plant amendments may be considered.
4. No soil-conditioning or plant-amending ingredient may be listed or guaranteed on the labeling of soil conditioners and plant amendments without Department approval. The Department may also require that satisfactory supportive data be provided to substantiate the usefulness of each soil-conditioning or plant-amending ingredient.
5. The active soil-conditioning or plant-amending ingredient in the product must be determinable by laboratory testing, and may be subject to inspection and analysis prior to registration approval.
6. When the labels have been approved, a certificate of registration will be mailed to you.
7. **All registrations expire on June 30 of each year.** Please note: The fertilizer law makes no provision for reducing or remitting any part of the fee to cover any fraction of the year.

INSPECTION FEES:

- Registrants, except those who package fertilizers, soil conditioners and/or plant amendments in containers of 10 pounds or less, must pay for all commercial fertilizers that are distributed in the State of Colorado an inspection fee of \$.60/ton.
- Registrants of soil conditioners and/or plant amendments must pay an inspection fee of \$.10/ton.
- Registrants of specialty fertilizers packaged in containers of 10 pounds or less must pay an inspection fee of \$.075 per 100 pounds (\$.00075/pound).

Each registrant must file an annual tonnage affidavit (July 1 – June 30) within 45 days after each July 1 showing the tonnage of fertilizers, soil conditioners and/or plant amendments sold or distributed in the State of Colorado during the preceding 12-month period.

Each person, firm or corporation registering fertilizers, soil conditioners and/or plant amendments in the State of Colorado must keep adequate records showing the tonnage of all registered products shipped to, sold, offered for sale or distributed in the State of Colorado. The Commissioner and his duly authorized representatives shall have authority to examine such records to verify the statement of tonnage.
