Colorado income tax booklets won't arrive automatically by mail

State stops mailing income tax booklets

Due to the increase in electronic filings each year and to reduce mailing and printing costs, the Colorado Department of Revenue will discontinue the annual automatic mailing of income tax booklets to taxpayers.

Filing options are available

- NetFile -- This Web-based, free service is easy to use and available through Revenue Online:
 www.Colorado.gov/RevenueOnline Click Individual, then File a Return. For corporate or partnership returns, click Business and Sign Up to create Login access to the tax account, and then file the return.
- Tax software program
- Tax professional
- Paper return (Note: Paper filing increases your chances of errors and processing delays.) Forms may
 be downloaded from the Colorado Taxation Web site at www.TaxColorado.com under Tax Forms > Individual
 Income > Current Filing Year; or under the Corporation Income and Partnership Income forms Web pages.

Printed income booklets and forms will still be provided to participating libraries throughout the state. Booklets will also be available at all state tax district offices as well as all Colorado driver's license offices.

In recent years, the department has mailed booklets only to those taxpayers who have not made the switch to electronic filing.
