### **Synopsis of the Executive Order Establishing the Office of Community Living**

Vision: Increase access to community based supports for long-term care services (prevention and intervention services to skilled nursing care) that will enable people to live in the home of their choosing with the supports they need and participate in communities that value their contributions.

This includes/ means services and supports that:

- Provide services in a timely, responsive manner;
- Allow people to work and thrive;
- Are simple and sustainable;
- Strengthen consumer choice and self direction in service provision;
- Incorporate best practices, efficiency and quality in service delivery;
- Encourage integrated home- and community-based service delivery;
- Incorporate supportive housing and transportation;
- Builds in flexibility, and accountability;
- Are more life oriented, and less medically oriented
  - Support people prior to entry into Medicaid
- Payment to encourage consumer choice
- Empower families and care givers to participate

Charge:

- Create a plan/ path/ roadmap that redesigns all aspects of the long-term services and supports delivery system, including service models, payment structures and data systems to create efficient and person-centered community-based care that to improve outcomes, recognize limited resources, break down silos, and promote self-direction and person-centeredness.
  - Coordinate and integrate with the existing work of the Long-term Care Advisory sub committees, the Colorado Commission on Aging, and other planning groups to ensure a cohesive planning process for Colorado;
  - Build off of past work;
  - Coordinate with the Division of Housing, the Department of Public Health and Environment, Division of Regulatory Agencies , Department of Transportation, and the Department of Human Services;
  - Look at barriers to implementing vision;

- Identify issues of access
  - Infrastructure
  - Delivery including non Medicaid delivery systems
- Recommend changes (legislative, process and regulatory) and recommendations for 2013 and 2014;
- Sunset September 30, 2014.
