eCaST Reports and Report Date Parameters

Performance reports:

Report 80 – Core Indicator Report

Report 80A – Patients Failing Core Indicators

Report 84 – Breast Procedure Follow-up Report

Report 85 – Cervical Procedure Follow-up Report

Date Parameters: Always run for current MDE (CDC's Minimum Data Element) period start date – i.e for April 15th 2012 CDC submission the start date is 07/01/2010; end date: two months previous to date you are running report.

- This start date advances by six months twice per year (after the MDE submission to CDC). WWC will inform you when the start date for this report has advanced
- WWC reminds sites to run reports 84 and 85 monthly

Reports addressing data errors and payments:

Report 17 – Missing Data Report

Report 10 - Procedures Not Paid by Requested Funder

Report 22 – Incomplete Cases Not Yet Paid

Date Parameters: Always run these reports for the current fiscal year (for example FY12: **Start date: 06/30/2011; end date: 06/29/2012**

- Change these dates when the fiscal year changes (earlier fiscal year parameters are available for historic data)
- WWC reminds sites to run reports 10 and 17 monthly
- You will not receive reminders to run report 22 and should get in the habit of checking this report on a regular basis

Notes:

- Use report cheat sheets to assist you regarding what the errors means and what must be done to correct them.
- It may for helpful to new eCaST users to run reports weekly until you are accustom to how to relate them to your work.
- Large agencies may benefit from running reports up to once weekly. You may
 decrease the occurrence to at least every other week or monthly after you
 understand how to use the reports.
- Small agencies may not need to run reports more often than monthly
