APPLICANT INSTRUCTIONS

Basic Requirements. In order to perform electrical contracting in the state of Colorado, you must complete a Colorado Electrical Contractor's application, pay the current registration fee, and meet the following criteria:

You must either be, or employ as a full-time employee, a Colorado-licensed master electrician who is the responsible party for all electrical work the company performs. The master electrician must sign an *Acknowledgment of Responsibility* form, and can only be the responsible party for one company at a time.

About the Application. This application is to be completed by you and returned to the Office of Licensing. All questions on the application are mandatory, and all supporting documents must be submitted with the application. You may copy as many forms as needed; however, each form submitted must be completed in original ink or typed. Keep a copy of the completed application for your records.

Application Expiration. Your application will be kept on file for one (1) year from date of receipt in the Division of Professions and Occupations. Your file and all supporting documentation will be purged if you do not submit required documents and complete your application process in one year. You will need to resubmit a new application packet and fee after that time.

Disclosure of Addresses. Consistent with Colorado law, all addresses and phone numbers on record with the Division are public record and must be provided to the public when requested. It is your responsibility to keep your address and contact information up-to-date in our database. All letters, renewal notices, licenses, and registrations are mailed to the last known address of record. **If your address is not current, it is possible you will not receive important documents.** You can change your address online by using Online Services at www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/onlineservices.

License Expiration Grace Period for New Applicants. Applicants who are issued an electrical contractor registration within 120 days of the upcoming expiration date will be issued a registration with the subsequent expiration date. For example, registrations issued between June 1, 2014, and September 30, 2014, will reflect a registration expiration date of September 30, 2017. Registrations issued prior to June 1, 2014 will reflect an expiration date of September 30, 2014 and must renew in the upcoming renewal period.

Electrical contractor registrations expire on September 30 of each renewal year and must be renewed to continue practicing.

In 2011, new legislation affecting electrician license renewal requirements takes effect. As part of this new legislation, electrical contractor registrations will change to a 3-year renewal cycle coinciding with the adoption of a new National Electrical Code (NEC) every three years (i.e., in 2011, 2014, 2017, etc.).

Checking Your Application Status. Visit Online Services at www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/onlineservices to track your application from the date we log it in our database to the date your license is printed. Please allow us enough time to receive the application through the mail and enter your application into our database before you check the website. We recommend waiting at least 10 business days from date of mailing before checking the status of your application.

SUBJECT: Licensure and Criminal History

Thank you for your interest in becoming a licensed* professional within the Division of Professions and Occupations. Before you submit your application, please be aware of a few facts regarding criminal conduct, convictions, and disciplinary actions in other states.

The mission of the Division of Professions and Occupations is "public protection through effective licensure and enforcement." One way the Division safeguards consumers is by issuing licenses to fully qualified, competent, and ethical applicants.

During the licensing process – and depending on the specific application – the Division may ask whether you have ever been disciplined in any state, arrested, charged, convicted, or pled guilty to a crime. An arrest, subsequent criminal conviction, or disciplinary action is not an automatic disqualification from licensure. Rather, the appropriate board or program will look at the facts surrounding the criminal conduct and disciplinary action in addressing your license application. You should know that licensure is a privilege, not a right. One thing you must do to obtain the privilege is to be complete and accurate in disclosing information on your application.

Be sure to list all relevant complaints, disciplinary actions, arrests, charges, or convictions in response to the appropriate licensure questions. **Failure to fully and accurately disclose requested criminal history information, alone, could constitute grounds for denial of your application or revocation of your license.** When requested, you must include information regarding prior conduct. This remains the case when the conduct is seemingly unrelated to the activities of a profession, and when the conduct involves deferred sentences or judgments.

Remember, even following licensure, you are still required to notify your professional licensing board or program about subsequent convictions and disciplinary actions in other states.

Please be aware that the Division conducts audits of its licensing database against several criminal and national disciplinary databases. This allows the Division to verify the truthfulness of your application and track subsequent criminal and disciplinary conduct after initial licensure. Keep in mind, your license will not necessarily be revoked, or your application denied, if you have been disciplined, arrested, charged or convicted. But, you will most likely be denied or revoked if you fail to disclose requested information.

*The word "license" is used as a general term. While most of the professions and occupations are licensed, others may be registered, certified, or listed. For precise terminology and requirements related to a profession or occupation, please consult the website of the appropriate board or program.

Statutory Authority:

Colorado Revised Statute 12-23-106 (5)(d) No holder of a master's license shall be named as the master electrician, under the provisions of paragraphs (b) and (c) of this subsection (5), for more than one contractor, and a master named shall be actively engaged in a full-time capacity with that contracting company. The qualifying master license holder shall be required to notify the state electrical board within fifteen days after his termination as a qualifying master holder. The master license holder is responsible for all electrical work performed by the electrical contracting company. Failure to comply with a notification may lead to suspension or revocation of the master license as provided in section 12-23-118.

^{*} Social Security Number Disclosure: Section 24-34-107(1) of the Colorado Revised Statutes requires that every application by an individual for a license issued pursuant to the authority set forth in title 12, C.R.S., by the Department of Regulatory Agencies, shall require the applicant's social security number.
