

## **APPLICATION FOR ORIGINAL LICENSE BY EXAMINATION—ELECTRICIAN**

### **APPLICANT INSTRUCTIONS**

If you hold an active electrician's license in another state, you may qualify for licensure by endorsement. Refer to Electrical Board Rule 5.6 at [www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/electrical](http://www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/electrical) for necessary requirements. The endorsement application is available online at [www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/electrical](http://www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/electrical).

**NEW License Renewal Requirements.** Beginning January 1, 2011 new renewal requirements apply to your license. Important details are available online at [www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/electrical](http://www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/electrical).

**Mandatory Practice Act.** Colorado has a mandatory practice act, which means that you may not practice as an Electrician in this state without a Colorado license. Submission of this application does not guarantee licensure. Therefore, do not make life or career decisions based on the probability that you may receive a license. Plan ahead for the time it will take for us to receive all required documents and complete our evaluation.

**About the Application.** This application is to be completed by you and returned to the Office of Licensing. All questions on the application are mandatory, and all supporting documents must be submitted with the application. You may copy as many forms as needed; however, each form submitted must be completed in original ink or typed. Keep a copy of the completed application for your records.

**Application Expiration.** Your application will be kept on file for one (1) year from date of receipt in the Division of Professions and Occupations. Your file and all supporting documentation will be purged if you do not submit required documents and complete your application process in one year. You will need to resubmit a new application packet and fee after that time.

- If you submitted an application within the last year and were notified that you did not meet the requirements and you are submitting an update, you do not need to complete a new application or submit additional fees.
- Persons who have been licensed as an electrician at a different level do not need to resubmit experience verification submitted with previous applications.

**Temporary Work Permits.** If you require a temporary work permit, mark the appropriate box on the application. Only one temporary work permit can be issued to an applicant after approval for testing has been granted. Permits will be issued for a 30-day period only. If after the expiration of the work permit you have failed for any reason to qualify for licensure, you shall cease and desist from working at the level of the temporary approval until such time as you are able to pass the exam and qualify for licensure. If you are not already licensed in another category, you must register as an apprentice and work with supervision.

**Examination Information.** The electrical licensing examination is administered by PSI, a private testing agency. Once your application has been approved, you will be sent an approval letter explaining how to schedule the exam and pay the required examination fee. The exam is available on the testing agency website, [www.psiexams.com](http://www.psiexams.com). You may contact PSI at (800) 733-9267.

- Exam fees must be paid at the time the reservation is made. Payments are not accepted at the test center.

## APPLICANT INSTRUCTIONS (Continued)

**Applicants with Disabilities.** Applicants who need modifications in the examination administration because of a disability should submit their request on a form available for download from the Board website at [www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/ADA](http://www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/ADA), or which can be obtained from the Office of Licensing. The ADA Request Form should be submitted at the same time as your application.

**Social Security Number is Required.** Effective January 1, 2009, a Social Security Number is required for all licensees. The Division will consider an application to be incomplete when the applicant fails to submit his/her Social Security Number. Exceptions are made for foreign nationals not physically present in the United States and for non-immigrants in the United States on student visas who do not have a Social Security Number. These applicants must submit a signed Social Security Number Affidavit in lieu of a Social Security Number. You may call (303) 894-7800 to request that an affidavit be mailed to you.

**Disclosure of Addresses.** Consistent with Colorado law, all addresses and phone numbers on record with the Division are public record and must be provided to the public when requested. It is your responsibility to keep your address and contact information up-to-date in our database. All letters, renewal notices, and licenses are mailed to the last known address of record. **If your address is not current, it is possible you will not receive important documents.** You can change your address online by using Online Services at [www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/onlineservices](http://www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/onlineservices).

**Checking Your Application Status.** Visit Online Services at [www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/onlineservices](http://www.dora.colorado.gov/professions/onlineservices) to track your application from the date we log it in our database to the date your license is printed. Please allow us enough time to receive the application through the mail and enter your application into our database before you check the website. We recommend waiting at least 10 business days from date of mailing before checking the status of your application.

**License Expiration Grace Period for New Applicants.** Applicants who are issued an electrician license within 120 days of the upcoming expiration date will be issued a license with the subsequent expiration date. For example, licenses issued between June 1, 2014, and September 30, 2014, will reflect a license expiration date of September 30, 2017. Licenses issued prior to June 1, 2014 will have an expiration date of September 30, 2014 and must renew in the upcoming renewal period.

- All Electrician licenses expire on September 30 of each renewal year and must be renewed to continue practicing.

In 2011, new legislation affecting electrician license renewal requirements took effect. As part of this new legislation, electrician licenses changed to a 3-year renewal cycle coinciding with the adoption of a new National Electrical Code (NEC) every three years (i.e., in 2011, 2014, 2017, etc.).

## APPLICANT CHECKLIST

To apply for a Colorado **Electrician** license by examination:

- Complete the attached application.** Return the completed application and all supporting documentation to the Office of Licensing.
- Enclose the non-refundable application processing fee.** See page 1 of the application form for current fees. Fees may be paid by a check or money order drawn in U.S. dollars on a U.S. bank and **made payable to State of Colorado.** All fees are non-refundable and subject to change every July 1.
- Complete and return the attached Affidavit of Eligibility form.** Pursuant to C.R.S .24-34-107, all applicants for licensure are required to complete and sign an Affidavit of Eligibility, and may also be required to provide a copy of a secure and verifiable document.
- Provide documentation of any name change.** If your name has changed since you obtained a previously-issued license, or if your name is different on any of your supporting documentation, you must provide a copy of the legal document verifying the name change (i.e., marriage license, divorce decree, or court order).
- Document your experience and work history on the attached Affidavit of Experience.**

You must submit verification of the minimum experience requirements with your application. **All experience obtained after July 1, 2005, must be verified on the form provided with this application (Affidavit of Experience).** No other letters of verification will be accepted for experience gained after that date. **For experience obtained before July 1, 2005,** the Board will accept letters from the employer. Letters verifying experience from before July 1, 2005, must be on original company letterhead (photocopies will not be accepted) and must include the following information:

- Dates of employment – month, day, and year
- The total hours or months worked
- A breakdown of the experience (in either hours, months, or percent of total time worked) in each area such as residential wiring, commercial/industrial, planning and layout, maintenance, etc. The specific types of maintenance must be detailed by the employer.
- The letter must be dated and signed by a representative of the company.

See the last page of this application packet for experience requirements for each license level.

- Document your trade related education and formal instruction, if applicable.** List within the application all the education or approved training programs you have attended. Send copies of all certificates you have earned. Transcripts from schools must be sent to us in sealed envelopes from the school. Ask the school to send it to you in a separate sealed school envelope, and then attach it to your application.
- If your employer(s) has not registered you as an apprentice, submit additional information.**

If you have worked in Colorado and were not registered as an apprentice, you must include a written attestation from the responsible master electrician verifying that you have been performing electrical work during the unregistered period. **NOTE:** Failure of a trainee or apprentice to register as provided in Colorado Revised Statutes 12-23-110.5(3)(a) may result in disallowance of your experience.

Applicants for the journeyman examination who hold a residential wireman license must also be registered as an apprentice and be able to verify two full years of commercial and industrial experience to qualify.

Thank you for your interest in becoming a licensed\* professional within the Division of Professions and Occupations. Before you submit your application, please be aware of a few facts regarding criminal conduct, convictions, and disciplinary actions in other states.

The mission of the Division of Professions and Occupations is “public protection through effective licensure and enforcement.” One way the Division safeguards consumers is by issuing licenses to fully qualified, competent, and ethical applicants.

During the licensing process – and depending on the specific application – the Division will ask whether you have ever been disciplined in any state, arrested, charged, convicted, or pled guilty to a crime. An arrest, subsequent criminal conviction, or disciplinary action is not an automatic disqualification from licensure. Instead, the appropriate board or program will look at the facts surrounding the criminal conduct and disciplinary action to determine whether you are fit for licensure. You should know that licensure is a privilege, not a right. One thing you must do to obtain the privilege is to be completely honest on your application.

Be sure to list all relevant complaints, disciplinary actions, arrests, charges, or convictions in response to the licensure questions. Failure to fully disclose could constitute grounds alone for denial of your application or revocation of your license. More important, avoid some of the common excuses we have heard from people who failed to disclose, such as:

- My attorney told me I didn’t have to disclose the criminal conduct or disciplinary actions.
- I didn’t think the prior conduct had anything to do with the profession.
- I didn’t think the disciplinary action, arrest, charges, or conviction was still on my record.
- I didn’t think it was subject to disclosure because I received a deferred sentence/judgment.

Remember, there is no excuse not to disclose disciplinary actions and criminal conduct. Even after licensure, you are still required to notify your professional licensing board or program about subsequent convictions and disciplinary actions in other states.

The Division conducts audits of its licensing database against several criminal and national disciplinary databases. This allows the Division to verify the truthfulness of your application and track subsequent criminal and disciplinary conduct after initial licensure. Keep in mind, you will not necessarily be revoked or denied a license if you have been disciplined, arrested, charged or convicted, but you will most likely be denied or revoked if you fail to disclose it.

## WORK EXPERIENCE DEFINITIONS

### RESIDENTIAL

Includes new construction, remodeling and additions to buildings for residential occupancy (one, two, three, and four-unit family dwellings). Also include apartment buildings, condominiums, and townhouses. Work done within all residential units will receive residential credit. Work done in common areas such as laundry rooms, corridors, rec. rooms, etc. will receive commercial credit. **DO NOT** include mobile park service facilities.

### COMMERCIAL

Includes new construction remodeling and additions to stores, office buildings, gas stations, theaters, mobile home park supply, irrigation pumps, warehouses, hospitals, and other buildings and facilities of a similar nature.

### INDUSTRIAL

Includes remodeling, additions, and new construction of manufacturing plants of all types.

### MAINTENANCE

Includes all time spent in repairing, replacing and taking care of existing electrical facilities.

### PLANNING AND LAYOUT OF ELECTRICAL WORK

Includes the time that you have spent in actually planning and laying out the installation of wiring apparatus, or equipment for electrical light, heat and power.

## EXPERIENCE REQUIREMENTS

### RESIDENTIAL WIREMAN

A minimum of two (2) years and 4,000 hours of experience in wiring one, two, three and four-unit family dwellings

### JOURNEYMAN ELECTRICIAN

A minimum of four (4) years and 8,000 hours of experience in the wiring for light, heat and power of which a minimum of two (2) years and 4,000 hours in commercial and/or industrial work

### MASTER ELECTRICIAN

- A minimum of five (5) years and 10,000 hours of experience in the wiring for light, heat and power **with** a minimum of two (2) years and 4,000 hours in commercial and/or industrial work, **OR**
- Be a graduate of an electrical trade school or community college approved by the Board **and** a minimum of four (4) years and 8,000 hours of practical experience in electrical work, **OR**
- Be a graduate electrical engineer of an accredited college or university **and** a minimum of one (1) year and 2,000 hours of practical electrical experience wiring for light, heat and power.
