A New Take on the Bohus Style– Friday, June 6, 2014

Level: Advanced Beginner to Intermediate; students should be able to knit, purl and have at least tried knitting with more than one color and knitting in the round– don't worry– we'll practice.

Class Description: Would you like to learn another style of colorwork? Come join Suzanne in her take on the Bohus Knitting Style. Bohus was developed in the 1930's as a means of economic development. It is traditionally done with an Angora-blend color yarn on a wool background. Purl stitches add the unique texture. We will be working with fingering weight yarn to start a pair of wristlets in a yarn people with allergies wont have problems with.

Materials: \$16 (collected by instructor at class) will include a handout with basic pattern (pattern worth \$6 by itself at least) and fingering weight yarn to work our samples.
