Toe-Up Socks using Magic Loop Technique
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Level: Intermediate/Advanced

Students: 8

Class description: The magic loop (one circular needle) technique for toe-up socks is a convenient way to make a pair of socks in a weekend. You will learn one way to cast-on, work the heel structure and to cast off. We will use somewhat thicker yarn to learn the techniques a little bit easier. The goal of the two day class is to finish one pair of adult socks for you. Everyone will try on their socks in different stages at numerous times. I will bring different stages of sock examples and lots of finished socks. There will be hand-outs with colored pictures and we will talk about other techniques for casting on, heel and casting off, as well as designs, yarns and an idea for a fabulous sock book which is my favorite one. There might be some homework between the first and the second day (no worries should not be much).

Materials fee: \$10 (collected by instructor at class) will include written hand-outs with colored pictures.

Students to bring: 40" circular needle size 3.5mm (#4 US); 2 additional 3.5mm (#4 US) needles (length does not matter or 2 large stitch holders; 2 double pointed needles size 3.5mm (#4 US); around 350 yards sports to worsted yarn in a solid light color (not black) however at least two skeins; some bulky scrap yarn; stitch markers; Pen or Pencil
