## Colorado Agencies Save Taxpayers over \$7.4 Million in 2016 with 1033 Program

Over the course of the federal fiscal year from October 1, 2015 to September 30, 2016, **law enforcement agencies in Colorado acquired \$7,477,869 of equipment** from the Department of Defense through the 1033 Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) program.

Including the equipment acquired this year, Colorado agencies currently have the use of \$25,450,109 worth of equipment that belongs to the Department of De-

fense.

Rather than pay that full value for the equipment, agencies only paid for transportation. In a great deal for taxpayers, this equipment is helping to stretch the budgets of local law enforcement agencies across the state.

Here is a sample of some of the equipment that creative

agencies across the state have acquired this year:

- Tool kit
- Vacuum cleaner
- Generator
- Air compressor
- Refrigerator
- Defibrillator
- First aid kit
- Reflex sight
- All terrain vehicle
- Cargo carrier
- Cold weather jacket
- Hand sanitizer

### 1033 LESO Program Annual Inventory Certification

October marks the opening of the 1033 Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) Program annual inventory certification process. **The online certification process must be completed by December 15 in order for agencies to remain compliant with the 1033 LESO Program.**

This is our opportunity to clean up the online records so that they match the physical world. Contact our office to correct any discrepancies between the physical and online inventory numbers.

As you know, the annual inventory certification is a valuable tool for promoting the transparency and accountability of the 1033 LESO Program. Keeping accurate records enhances the program's reputation and enables us to continue acquiring valuable equipment.

Statewide accountability benefits every agency. Therefore, one late agency will hold up the entire state. Don't be that agency!

If any single agency in Colorado has not completed the online certification by the deadline, then the entire state will be suspended from acquiring equipment until the certification is completed by every participating agency.

**Three things are necessary to complete the inventory certification:**

1. Current State Plan of Operation signed by the Chief or Sheriff
2. Physical inspection of items on the agency's 1033 inventory list
3. Completion of the online certification on FAMWEB LESO FEPMIS.

After physically inspecting equipment, the simple online process takes about 10 minutes for most agencies to complete.

If you need to reset your password, call 866-224-7677 option 4. Contact our office if you need to set up an account.

Remember that the FAMWEB logon is in a pop-up window; disable the pop-up blocker on your browser if you do not see the logon window.

After logging on, go to LESO FEPMIS. In the new window, go to LESO Inventory to search for your station and complete the certification.

The Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) within the Department of Defense (DoD), Defense Logistics Agency, facilitates the 1033 LESO program. This program allows transfer of excess DoD property that might otherwise be destroyed to law enforcement agencies across the United States.

Section 1122 of the National Defense Authorization Act authorizes state and local agencies to purchase equipment and supplies in support of counter-drug, homeland security, and emergency response activities through federal sources of supply. Agencies can take advantage of the volume buying power of the Federal Government for low prices.

## 1033 LESO Program Compliance Reviews in the Northeast in October

In an ongoing effort to maintain accountability in the Colorado 1033 Law Enforcement Support Office (LESO) Program, we will be visiting participating agencies in the northeastern corner of the state in October.

Program compliance reviews usually take about 30-45 minutes. They are a time for us to learn more about how you use the program and to answer your questions.

During a visit we will inspect the equipment an agency has

on their current 1033 inventory list, check the paperwork, discuss program rules and changes, and talk about how that agency uses the program.

You can prepare for a visit by pulling together your paper-

work, locating and centralizing your equipment, and thinking of questions or topics that you would like to discuss.
