CHIEF'S REPORT – By Brian Lurvey

See detailed report from the Chief. In summary:

Members: One application pending – she is an EMT. Our number of volunteers is good. We can be a little more particular on new hires now.

Vehicles: Ambulance 111 sire was inoperable. Jamin and Paul fixed it. We have had a lot of help with vehicle maintenance over the last few months with volunteers. Jamin and Paul have been great working and troubleshooting problems. Saving the department on money and time.

Have a white board set up for information and needs on vehicles and equipment. It's nice to see the work getting done.

Grants: Waiting on the FEMA grant for a new ambulance. Waiting for VFA grant on wildland gear.

Training: Have changed training to every Thursday. We have a CPR class this Thursday for our members. Wildland certification coming in March/April.

Other: Working on putting Tender 111 on a national call-out list for wildland fires. We are working on specific SOP's as it relates to this. The drivers must be certified in S130 and S190 to go out on calls and be on the national call out list. When the vehicle gets called out, they pay \$350 - \$899/day for the Tender. The people get paid by the State. Last year there were 37 calls in which they didn't receive a response. We are hoping to be available for some of those calls
