This Thanksgiving was especially memorable for two Loveland residents, who will move into homes completed by Loveland Habitat for Humanity on November 24. Both homes were constructed for individuals who lost their homes in the 2013 Floods and have been working with the Disaster Case Management Program in Larimer County. Each Habitat-built home was purchased by the clients, with the help of Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Relief funded Down Payment Assistance provided by the Loveland Housing Authority.

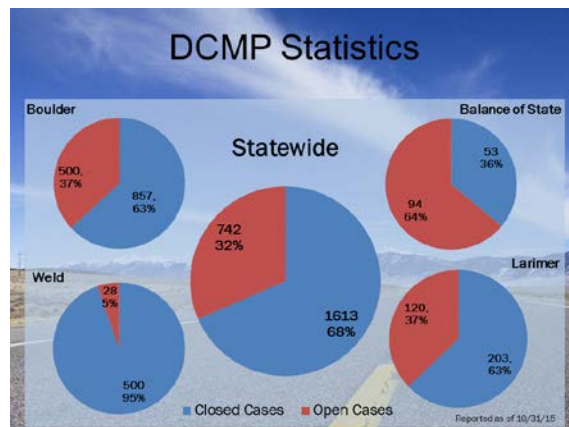

Program Update

- **Weld County Successes**

- Under the Community Development Block Grant – Disaster Relief (CDBG-DR) program, the Weld County Housing Authority recently placed six Weld County families in new mobile homes that replaced those lost in the 2013 floods. The Disaster Case Management Program (DCMP) staff worked with these families over many months to assist them with the application process, provide encourage and help find resources to help with other needs.
- In several cases, Weld Recovers provided a House in a Box package (furniture, bedding, kitchen items) and Catholic Charities provided funding for appliances and additional household items. In another instance, Weld Recovers also helped fund materials for a deck and Brethren Disaster Ministries built it. In early November, three related Evans families were able to leave CDBG-DR temporary rental assistance program apartments and use CDBG-DR funds to purchase price new mobile homes in close proximity to one another.
- On Wednesday, November 25, an elderly couple was expected to close on a new American with Disabilities Act (ADA) compliant mobile home. After losing their home in the flood, the couple lived in a camper until last winter. When health issues prompted them to call for help, Weld Recovers and DCMP worked with the Housing Authority to place them in a CDBG-DR funded apartment. Subsequently, the Housing Authority and Weld Recovers worked diligently to help this couple find and purchase a new ADA compliant mobile home with CDBG-DR and Weld Recovers Unmet Needs funds.

- **Disaster Case Management Program (DCMP) November 23, 2015**

- Many of the remaining Disaster Case Management cases are in the process of obtaining assistance through Community Development Block Grant-Disaster Recovery (CDBG-DR) programs administered by Colorado’s Department of Local Affairs (DOLA). Others are being referred to Long Term Recovery Group (LTRG) Unmet Needs Committees in Boulder, Larimer and Weld counties, or local non-profits with available resources.

FEMA has announced PDM program availability for this year. A State application, including sub-applications, was submitted to FEMA on August 28, 2015.

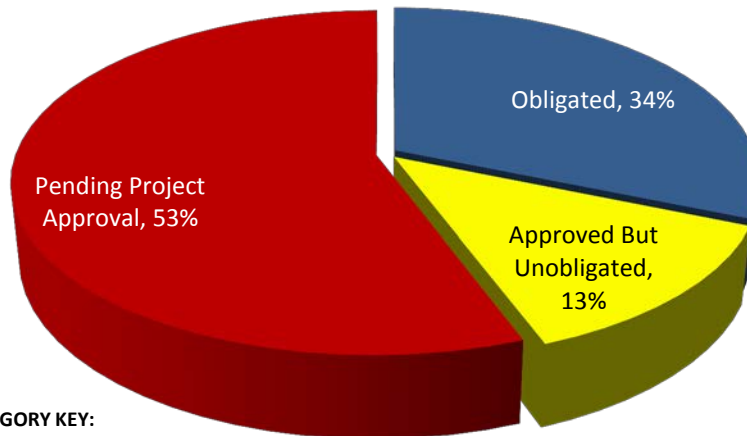
Program Update

FEMA continues to review project applications. Only eight projects remain in the initial FEMA review queue due to extended project analysis, technical feasibility, environmental, historical, cultural review/studies and/or project phasing deliverables. The majority of projects have been awarded and the state continues to coordinate projects still under review.

The State has reviewed all HMGP DR-4229 Notice of Interest (NOI) for programmatic eligibility and technical feasibility. Notifications will be sent to NOI points of contact soon with further instructions on the next steps in the HMGP process.

DHSEM will be hosting a Benefit Cost Analysis (BCA) 2 day training on Thursday, December 10 through Friday December 11, 2015 at the State EOC. Projects submitted for the HMGP must demonstrate cost effectiveness through FEMA's BCA tool. Applicants for HMGP DR-4229 are all strongly encouraged to attend. The training will be conducted by a FEMA subject matter expert and will review the newly released version of FEMA's BCA Tool Version 5.2.1

DR-4145

- In the last week, 31 requests for reimbursements (RFRs) were submitted, and 13 RFRs have been recommended for payment. The total amount of RFRs is now at 1,562 of which 1,117 are recommended for payment and 228 were returned to the sub-grantees for additional information. The remaining 217 are in progress. The total amount requested is \$185.5 million, and \$164.7 million is considered initially eligible. \$115.6 million has been recommended for payment, \$20.3 million has been returned to sub-grantees for additional information, and \$28.8 million is still in progress.

- Four requests for scope changes were submitted in the last week, and 14 were completed or deferred to closeout. The total amount of scope change requests is now 404 of which 284 are completed or deferred to closeout, and 62 were returned to the sub-grantees for additional information. The remaining 58 are in progress.
- There have been 50 payments made in the last week for total of \$2,564,283.70 including federal and state share.
