BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS Minutes of Meeting October 3, 2017

The Board of Morgan County Commissioners met Tuesday, October 3, 2017 at 9:01 a.m. with Chairman James Zwetzig, Commissioner Laura Teague and Commissioner Mark Arndt in attendance. Chairman James Zwetzig called the meeting to order and asked Morgan County Planning Director/Flood Plain Administrator Pam Cherry to lead the meeting in the Pledge of Allegiance.

ADOPTION OF THE AGENDA

Commissioner Teague made a motion to adopt the agenda as presented, with Commissioner Arndt seconding the motion. Motion carried 3-0.

Commissioner Arndt made a motion to approve all items on the Consent Agenda as presented. Commissioner Teague seconded the motion. At this time Chairman Zwetzig made mention of the last two items on the consent agenda which reflects revisions to the maps which were attached to the right of way permits for Western Sugar. At this time the motion carried 3-0.

GENERAL BUSINESS AND ADMINISTRATIVE ITEMS

Consideration of Approval – FEE SCHEDULE – Combination of Lots Agreements

Morgan County Planning Director/Floodplain Administrator Pam Cherry presented to the Board the fee schedule for the Planning and Zoning Department. Ms. Cherry explained the resolution to develop a lot combination process was approved in July. The fee for the combination of lots agreement is suggested to be \$300.00 and asked that this fee be adopted as part of the Morgan County Fee Schedule.

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Commissioner Teague made a motion to approve the fee schedule for the Morgan County Planning and Zoning Department as presented by Morgan County Planning Director/Floodplain Administrator Pam Cherry with Commissioner Arndt seconding the motion. At this time, the motion carried 3-0.

COUNTY OFFICIAL AND DEPARTMENT HEAD REPORTS

Chairman Zwetzig asked that everyone stand and join in a moment of silence to express respect to those involved in the recent events which occurred in Las Vegas, Nevada.

Commissioners reviewed the calendar dated September 29, 2017 through October 10, 2017 with no changes.

Morgan County Clerk and Recorder Susan Bailey announced the Logic and Accuracy Testing scheduled for Tuesday, October 10th at 8:30 a.m. with an alternate date of October 12th. She noted that representatives from each entity who are participating in the upcoming coordinated election will be present at this testing as well as a representative from Dominion Voting Equipment who will assist the County with this process.

UNFINISHED BUSINESS

There was no unfinished business.

CITIZEN'S COMMENT

There was no citizen's in attendance to provide citizens comment.

At this time, the Board recessed at 9:07 a.m. until the Public Hearing scheduled at 9:30 a.m.

PUBLIC HEARING

Chairman Zwetzig called the hearing to order at 9:30 a.m. in the Assembly Room of the Morgan County Administration Building. Present were Chairman James Zwetzig, Commissioner Laura Teague and Commissioner Mark Arndt. Also present was Morgan County Planning and Zoning Planning Director/Floodplain Administrator Pam Cherry and staff.

Application is for an Exemption from subdivision of 5.0 acres located in the SE1/4 of Section 25, Township 2 North, Range 60 West of the 6th P.M., Morgan County, Colorado. The property will be known as 05971 County Road H, Wiggins, Colorado 80654.

Chairman Zwetzig asked Morgan County Planning and Zoning Planning Director/Floodplain Administrator Pam Cherry to present the file at which time Ms. Cherry stated the Applicant/Landowner has Requested Continuation to October 17, 2017 as the applicant has been working on the drainage engineering. Chairman Zwetzig stated this was tabled to a certain date specific so publications would not have to be sent.

At this time, Chairman Zwetzig asked if there was anyone present to speak regarding this matter with no comments made.

Commissioner Arndt made a motion to continue the matter as requested by the Applicant/Landowner Craig Gerhard Potthoff to October 17, 2017 with Commissioner Teague seconding the motion and motion carried 3-0.

**Application is for a Minor Subdivision of Abe's Place Minor Subdivision Lot 2 which is 23.7 acres and is located in the NW1/4 of Section 21, Township 3 North, Range 60W of the 6th P.M., Morgan County, Colorado. The property is also known as 2276 County Road P, Wiggins, Colorado 80654.

Chairman Zwetzig asked Morgan County Planning and Zoning Planning Director/Floodplain Administrator Pam Cherry to present the file at which time Ms. Cherry stated the Applicant/Landowner has Requested Continuation to January 9, 2018 while they work on a water replacement plan with a water consultant.

At this time, Chairman Zwetzig opened the matter for public comment. Andy McClary, Attorney for North Kiowa and Bijou Groundwater Management District, address being 507 Warner, Fort Morgan, Colorado, asked for clarification that the applicant has been asked to obtain a water consultant. Ms. Cherry stated it has been recommended due to the State indicating the applicant will need to re-permit the well and provide a replacement plan. Mr. McClary informed the Board that he does not believe the applicants will be able to provide a replacement plan due to the fact there is no Denver Basin water there. He further indicated that the district has approached the State about this issue in an attempt to resolve the matter given the fact that this applicant has already drilled a well. Mr. McClary stated the district made an offer to the State about three weeks ago and that offer indicates the well to be at 3 acre feet, not six acre feet. Mr. McClary stated the Board could have Mr. Jude's water consultant contact him for further information and hopes this will be helpful to the applicant.

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Commissioner Teague made a motion to continue the matter as requested by the Applicant/Landowner Thomas A. Jude to January 9, 2018 with Commissioner Arndt seconding the motion and motion carried 3-0.

Application is for a Conditional Use Permit to construct a eighty foot (80') self-supporting communications tower located in the NE1/4 of the NW1/4 of Section 14, Township 3 North, Range 60 West of the 6th P.M., Morgan County, Colorado, also known as 105 Karen Street, Wiggins, Colorado 80654

Applicant: Roggen Enterprises Broadband LLC
Landowner: Keith Miller

Chairman Zwetzig asked Morgan County Planning and Zoning Planning Director/Floodplain Administrator Pam Cherry to present the file at which time Ms. Cherry read aloud the following information.

Background Information

Ms. Cherry explained this application is for a Conditional Use Permit is to construct an eighty foot (80') self-supporting communications tower. The tower will be constructed in the NE $\frac{1}{4}$ of the NW $\frac{1}{4}$ of Section 14, Township 3N, Range 60W of the 6th P.M. Morgan County, Colorado; Parcel Number 1223-142-00-015. The property is also known as 105 Karen St, Wiggins, Colorado 80654. The property is zoned Commercial where the Zoning Regulations pursuant to Section 3-320(F) Communication facilities where height limits are exceeded is a Conditional Use. The tower proposed will be eighty feet (80') tall where the permitted height is fifty feet (50').

Ms. Cherry stated the application was originally submitted for administrative review and approval. However, objections had been received regarding the proximity, visual and safety impacts to neighboring residential uses. In cases where objections are received the application must go through the public hearing process. Letters of support and opposition are contained in your packets. A new opposition email was received this morning from Nicole Kammerer as well as an opposition email from Terry Hendrickson, Wiggins Telephone and provided a copy of these emails to the Board. The Planning Commission held a public hearing on this application on September 11, 2017. During the public hearing Nicole Kammerer of 4350 County Road Q provided testimony in opposition to the application because of health and aesthetic concerns. The Neb Brothers stopped by the office on September 26, 2017 to support the application because of a business need for improved internet technology in the Wiggins area.

Ms. Cherry stated Roggen Enterprises Broadband LLC as applicant seeks approval for a Conditional Use permit on property owned by Keith Miller in Wiggins. The footprint at the base of the tower will be 20'x20' and will be secured with a galvanized chain link fence, six feet in height, topped with one foot of barbed wire for security. Equipment mounted will be 5Ghz and 11Ghz FCC licensed communication towers to provide Hi-Speed Wireless Broadband Internet service to existing and new business and residential customers. The purpose of the tower is to replace an existing communication facility located at Wiggins Grain Elevator where it has been located since 2003. That tower will be demolished in the near future.

Ms. Cherry explained the current tower provides service to the Wiggins area and back hauls to the Weldona communications tower that provides internet service to Weldona, Goodrich and Orchard, including Jackson Lake. Without the upgrade, 150 residential and business customers in the area will be impacted. In addition the improvement of technology requires the upgrade of the tower to continue to service existing and future customers.

Ms. Cherry explained the criteria for review of a Conditional Use:

- A. The application documents are complete.
- B. The Site Plan was attached to the application.
- C. There are no off-site impacts imposed by the conditional use proposed that require additional infrastructure or upgrade by the County.
- D. The site plan shows the tower is adequately setback as necessary to prevent damage to adjacent properties. There has been concern and objection due to visual impact, safety and the proximity of the tower to residential uses.

At this time Ms. Cherry suggested conditions of approval:

1. All federal and state approvals for the tower shall be forwarded to the Morgan County Planning Department upon receipt for our files.

Ms. Cherry stated that the Planning Commission recommends approval of the Conditional Use application subject to the condition stated.

Chairman Zwetzig asked what the Planning Commission approved with Ms. Cherry stating they approved the matter 4-0, a unanimous approval by the Planning Commission.

At this time, Chairman Zwetzig called the applicant to the front to present their application.

Peggy Manino, General Manager of Roggen Enterprises Broadband LLC, address being 519 Front Street, Roggen, Colorado, also introduced Head Technician, Will Young, having the same address. Ms. Manino stated they have been in Wiggins for the last 14 years and they are here today to apply for this permit to continue providing broadband to the customers in the areas noted. She further indicated their current radio and antennas are placed on the Wiggins Elevator and they want to move the radios and antennas to another location to be able to keep their existing customers. She stated they are a small company in Weld County on the eastern edge of the County and are looking for assistance in getting this conditional use permit so they can continue serving the customers in this area.

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At this time, Chairman Zwetzig opened the matter for public comment at which there was public comment.

Terry Hendrickson, General Manager, Wiggins Telephone Association, 411 Main Street, Wiggins, Colorado doing business as Blue Lightning Broadband, stated they have been in business since 1951, certificated to serve the area in question today, and provided a map to the Board for their review. He stated that the portions in the map are certificated by the Public Utility Commission and they are the company that serves this area. He stated that they have been doing so since 1951. They completed an upgrade to the facilities to fiber connect to the homes in the area, stating they were not initially in the ISP business, when they launched their provider business in 2008/2009, they have seen great success. He stated their lowest package was 1.5 megabit which was what dialup speed used to be and are now up to 1 gigabit, which is 1000 megabits, full service Suite Company which provides customer service by the tower. He stated there are already other service providers in the area naming them stating there is plenty of competition in the area. They are willing to compete and coming to the commission today to ask them to support their business model at this time, stating they pay taxes, and the fiber build was at a cost to the business, confident to say they are easily investing over ten million dollars to place this fiber into the County. He outlined the loans they have with the USDA. He referred to the Fort Morgan Times article that came out and the support from local businesses, and stated they could receive support from WTA and stated the services they could provide. He further stated they support their schools, try to be a local partner with local businesses, charitable organizations, community organizations, Morgan County Fair and other agencies.

Mr. Hendrickson further stated as Wiggins is experiencing the growth, he believes by adding to the skyline, it is not the best when you are trying to increase land values and to grow houses and businesses in the area, and he does not see why they need to add another competitor and feels they are now up to speed with providing the service and are able to provide the service at a competitive pricing, and serve as a cooperative to their consumers comparable to Morgan County REA.

Chairman Zwetzig asked about the article that was placed in the Fort Morgan Times, with Mr. Hendrickson stating it was article regarding notification of the hearing date today.

Commissioner Teague asked about the Public Utility Commission certificated area, are the other providers allowed to work within this area, with Mr. Hendrickson stating they are required to work in the area as certificated, further stating that broadband is not regulated and neither are some of the services that can ride on broadband. He stated it is not based on best effort; they have to build it and meet the services that are regulated by the Public Utilities Commission.

Can other businesses provide voice only with Mr. Hendrickson stating they would have to come in and file as a competitor and explained what they did in the Weldona area, where they had to go to the PUC to be able to provide the voice services. He stated they serve high cost areas, to qualify for support, that gets them into federal dollars of support and get paid for access lines to the customer; it is not just the monthly bill that the customer pays to them, but the support that federal dollars that are also given to them.

Commissioner Arndt asked why he was not present at the Planning Commission meeting, he stated they did receive a letter, but was still researching what options they had to speak in regards to the matter and it was just recently that he found he was able to do so.

Chairman Zwetzig asked about the discussion held at Planning Commission in regards to the concerns the Kammerers stated with Ms. Cherry stating those concerns and the concerns they expressed as to radiation that could be to cause cancer and it is unproven that radiation from these towers do cause or do not cause cancer according to American Cancer Society. Commissioner Teague stated that the information is noted in the email and Ms. Cherry stated the email provided today is a very good representation of what Ms. Kammerer presented to the Planning Commission.

Ms. Cherry stated this is not considered a tower solely for internet usage, not a cell phone tower. She clarified that Viero has placed towers that provide cellular based internet service.

Ms. Manino stated that since broadband is not regulated by the PUC, this is where they came over 14 years ago, stating they did not have to apply for anything. They were able to take a loan like their regular COOP and go out and provide internet to those who did not have it and since then have gone slow, like the modem style, but now can provide faster internet speed to businesses to run credit card machines as well as security cameras, and able to provide computer service. They offer their own 24/7 support and also to the questions about Ms. Kammerer regarding the radiation, they do not call it radiation, they are microwave radios, stating these are located at the fire hall as well, and do not look at this as cancer causing, feeling that people have a bigger problem putting their cell phones to their ears.

They have a tower next to their main central office and have never experienced any security issues, no one has attempted to do any harm or damage to their towers and feel that it will be the same with Wiggins Electric stating who currently owns the property, being Keith Miller.

They feel they are far enough away from residential homes, and this being an 80 foot tower they do not believe that should be any issue.

Commissioner Arndt asked on the technical side, the current facility that is currently sitting on the old grain elevator, is it smaller in size, is the new equipment being what is being proposed, Mr. Young stated it is the same equipment they have on the elevator at this time and outlined the equipment that will be put in place. This will not increase their boosting power, they basically want to keep their existing footprint.

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Commissioner Teague asked if they had asked to place the equipment on the exiting site, with Mr. Young stating they had asked and it is placed on a Burlington Northern site and they are actually building a rail facility and it would not be an appropriate structure to place this equipment.

A use by right is 50 feet, and this is being requested at 80 feet, with Chairman Zwetzig asking what the difference is, why was 50 feet set as the standard, with Ms. Cherry stating she was not able to answer that. She stated this one will be set back far enough to not cause damage to any other properties.

Further discussion followed in regards to the existing buildings as being within the 80 foot fall, with Ms. Cherry stating it will be a lease agreement to Roggen Enterprises Broadband, LLC, and that should be his decision as to what he places in his lease agreement, and the rules state that it should be set back 80 feet from the property line, but does not state within the distance from the buildings.

Chairman Zwetzig asked if the Town of Wiggins was notified with Ms. Cherry stating they had been and they have made no comment. Ms. Cherry stated her last meeting with Mr. Larino, he had brought up the fact they did receive this notice but she has not received any comments from them as of this date.

Commissioner Teague asked if there are additional lights on this tower, with Mr. Young stating that is discretionary for FAA purposed.

Commissioner Arndt questioned about the possibility of comingling, asking if another provider wants to use the tower, would they allow for that option with Ms. Manino stating they would not. Ms. Cherry stated that it is her understanding that they are the only provider on this tower that is on the lease agreement with the property owner.

Commissioner Teague stated that Morgan County Ambulance currently has their radio communication set on a tower way south at Wiggins, and the expense to taxpayers, and wondered if this would be beneficial to use this tower to place the ambulance radio as an option in the future.

Chairman Zwetzig clarified the criteria the Board needs to review and the fact that competition is not listed, with Ms. Cherry stating that the criteria listed is what the Board should look at in making their determination and competition is not a part of that criteria. Upgrades by the County was clarified with Chairman Zwetzig asking if the pad of this tower being concrete, with Mr. Young stating yes it would be and Ms. Cherry outlined what the criteria requires and this structure does not meet the criteria of the 5000 feet requirement. Ms. Cherry stated the condition could be added but she does not see the area in question being concerning. She does not believe it would be the responsibility of Roggen Enterprises Broadband, LLC to resolve drainage issues in this area.

Compatible with surrounding uses, with Ms. Cherry stating it is a commercial zoned area and a communications tower is a conditional use for this height in the commercial zone. If it would have been a 50 foot tower, they would not be required to file for the conditional use permit.

It was pointed out on the GIS mapping being presented by power point where the tower will be located with representatives from Roggen Enterprises Broadband, LLC stating it is actually 100 feet from the property lines.

Commissioner Teague asked about the question regarding 24 hours surveillance and is that what they are committing to, with Mr. Young stating they could actually place 24 hour surveillance cameras if it is required but it would not be their normal practice.

Chairman Zwetzig asked Mr. Hendrickson if he had any further comments, with Mr. Hendrickson stating the 24 hour support and computer repair that their company also provides that support and fully supports their customers as well.

At this time, Chairman Zwetzig moved to discussion and decision.

Commissioner Teague asked Ms. Cherry if she got any feeling at all from Mr. Larino if they supported the project with Ms. Cherry stating that Mr. Larino had expressed his appreciation of receiving notices of projects in their area but has not made any comments regarding this matter since.

Commissioner Arndt stated his question was answered when they spoke about the equipment as being the same, and they are not trying to expand their services, and believes that would be dangerous ground for governmental entities to get into, with the same respect for Wiggins Telephone as well. He did note the one objection letter from Ms. Kammerer, but truly there are not scientific facts that would support this information at this time.

Chairman Zwetzig commented that he does believe the aesthetics is a consideration and it is unfortunate that our regulations do not address this other than 50 feet, and would find both 50 feet and 80 feet objectionable. He feels that there is better technology that does not require towers and feels this is something that could be looked at in the future with Ms. Cherry stating what she has seen previously as to aesthetics it is related to what is adopted by zoning regulations as to environmental regulations. Discussion followed with Commissioner Teague stating unfortunately, this is a commercial zone and this also could have other issues that would affect the aesthetics close to a residential area.

Chairman Zwetzig stated that in the future the County may want to look at how to handle these types of situations, and the fact that the aesthetics may need to be looked at close to a residential area.

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Discussion followed in regards to the comingling of services using a single tower to try and eliminate the number of towers being placed. Commissioner Teague stated that since the Town of Wiggins did not make comment in regards to the aesthetics of the tower being placed within their locale, that should satisfy that criteria.

At this time, a motion was made by Commissioner Teague to approve the application is for a Conditional Use Permit to construct a eighty foot (80') self-supporting communications tower located in the NE1/4 of the NW1/4 of Section 14, Township 3 North, Range 60 West of the 6th P.M., Morgan County, Colorado, also known as 105 Karen Street, Wiggins, Colorado 80654, naming the applicant as being Roggen Enterprises Broadband LLC and Landowner as being Keith Miller with the condition all federal and state approvals for the tower shall be forwarded to the Morgan County Planning Department upon receipt for their files. Commissioner Arndt seconded the motion, and the motion carried 3-0.

Being no further business, the meeting was adjourned at 10:18 a.m.
