WHEREAS, municipalities are authorized to levy taxes on the same kinds and classes of taxable property, including real property, within the municipality as are subject to taxation for state or county purposes §31-20-101, C.R.S.; and

WHEREAS, §29-1-301, C.R.S. et. seq. authorizes the governing body of any non-home rule municipality to establish annually whatever mill levy it deems necessary, as long as any increase does not exceed certain statutory limits; and

WHEREAS, approval by the electors of the municipality is necessary in general for a mill levy increase and specifically, before constitutional and statutory limits may be exceeded; and

WHEREAS, fiscal issues may be determined by qualified electors of a municipality at a biennial local district election; and

WHEREAS, the Town of Pitkin has determined that an increase in the Town's mill levy of 9.5 mills would provide approximately \$36,090.50 per year to be utilized to provide funds to the Streets and Ditches fund, to assist this department in providing services to the Town; and

WHEREAS, a 9.5 mill increase will cost each residential property owner approximately \$68.40 per \$100,000.00 property valuation, and each non-residential property owner approximately \$276.00 per \$100,000.00 property valuation.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Trustees of the Town of Pitkin, Colorado, that;

1. There shall be referred to the qualified electors of the Town of Pitkin, Colorado, by polling place election held on April 7, 2020, the following ballot proposal:

BALLOT ISSUE NO. 1

SHALL TOWN OF PITKIN, COLORADO, TAXES BE INCREASED <u>\$36,090.50</u> IN THE FIRST FISCAL YEAR (2020) AND ANNUALLY THEREAFTER IN SUCH AMOUNTS AS ARE RECEIVED EACH YEAR BY THE IMPOSITION OF AN ADDITIONAL MILL LEVY NOT TO EXCEED <u>9.5</u> MILLS UPON TAXABLE REAL PROPERTY WITHIN THE TOWN, COMMENCING
