ARTICLE I

In General

Sec. 3-1. Unclaimed property.

If the identity or location of the owner or person entitled to possession of property pursuant to Article 16 of Title 42, C.R.S., as amended, has not been ascertained within ninety (90) days after the Police Department obtains possession of such property, the Chief of Police or his or her designated representative shall effectuate the sale of such property according to the provisions of Section 42-16-103, C.R.S., as amended.

ARTICLE II

Special Police

Sec. 3-11. Definition.

In this Article, *special officer* means any person carrying on the business or occupation of security patrol service, night watch service, private police service, burglar alarm service operator or any other occupation the purpose of which is to afford additional police protection for hire or reward.

Sec. 3-12. License required; qualifications, appeal, fees.

(A) All persons desiring to do business within the City as special officers shall first apply for a business license. All such persons shall also be required to list the name, date of birth and address, along with other background and identification information, of each and every owner, operator, manager and employee of the company or person, on forms provided by the Police Department.

(B) All persons associated with or employed by any company or person in the occupation of special officer shall agree to submit to a background check by the Police Department.

(C) If any employee or person associated with the company or person operating the business is, due to the background investigation, considered a security risk for the City's citizens, that person shall not be licensed as a special officer within the limits of the City.

(D) Should any person rejected for a license as a special officer request a hearing to show cause why his or her background investigation is erroneous or constitutes insufficient grounds to deny him or her a license, such hearing must be requested within seven (7) days of the person being informed of such denial or seven (7) days after mailing of the notice of denial to the person's last known address, whichever occurs first. The hearing will be held before the City Council at one (1) of its regular meetings and its decision shall be final.

(E) In addition to the business license fees paid to the City, the person requesting a background check shall submit one (1) set of fingerprints and a nonrefundable investigation fee in the amount then charged by the Colorado Department of Public Safety, along with a City investigation fee as set forth in the City's fee schedule. Should a hearing under Subsection (D) be requested, an additional fee as set forth in the City's fee schedule shall be required prior to setting a hearing.

Sec. 3-13. Identifying uniforms and badges.

All special officers shall wear uniform clothing marked with a badge or patch that is distinctive for each company and that is in no way deceptively similar to the uniform in use by the Police Department.

Sec. 3-14. Vehicle emblems.

All vehicles used by special officers while working shall be marked with a sign or emblem that is distinctive for each company and that in no way is deceptively similar to the vehicle or emblem in use by the Police Department.

Sec. 3-15. Identification cards.

All special officers shall carry in the performance of their duties a photo identification card issued by their company that in no way is deceptively similar to that carried by officers of the Police Department.
