

1 **8.904 PROVISIONS APPLICABLE TO CLIENTS**

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7 F. Applicants Not Eligible

- 8 1. The following individuals are not eligible to receive discounted services under available
9 CICP funds:
- 10 a. Individuals for whom lawful presence cannot be verified.
- 11 b. Individuals who are being held or confined involuntarily under governmental control
12 in State or federal prisons, jails, detention facilities or other penal facilities. This
13 includes those individuals residing in detention centers awaiting trial, at a
14 wilderness camp, residing in half-way houses who have not been released on
15 parole, and those persons in the custody of a law enforcement agency
16 temporarily released for the sole purpose of receiving health care.
- 17 c. College students whose residence is from outside Colorado or the United States
18 that are in Colorado for the purpose of higher education. These students are not
19 Colorado residents and cannot receive services under the CICP.
- 20 d. Visitors from other states or countries temporarily visiting Colorado and have
21 primary residences outside of Colorado.
- 22 2. Persons who qualify for Medicaid. However, applicants whose only Medicaid benefits are
23 the following shall not be excluded from consideration for CICP eligibility:
- 24 a. QMB benefits described at section 10 C.C.R. 2505-10, Section 8.111.1 (2007) of
25 these regulations;
- 26 b. SLMB benefits described at section 10 C.C.R. 2505-10, Section 8.122 (2007), or
27 c. The Q11 benefits described at section 10 C.C.R. 2505-10, Section 8.123 (2007).
- 28 ~~d. Applicants who are on a waitlist — to become enrolled in Medicaid.~~
- 29 3. Individuals who are eligible for the Children's Basic Health Plan. However, individuals who
30 are waiting to become an enrollee in the Children's Basic Health Plan and/or have
31 incurred charges at a participating qualified health care provider in the 90 days prior to
32 the application date shall not be excluded from consideration for eligibility on a temporary
33 basis. Once the applicant becomes enrolled in the Children's Basic Health Plan, the
34 applicant is no longer eligible to receive discounted health care services under available
35 CICP funding.

36 8.907 CLIENT COPAYMENT

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39 B. Z-Rating. These are homeless clients, clients living in transitional housing, clients residing with others,
40 or recipients of Colorado's Aid to the Needy Disabled financial assistance program, who are at or
41 below 40% of the Federal Poverty Level (qualify for an N-Rating). These clients are exempt from
42 client copayments and are rated with the Z-rating. [Eff. 6/30/2008]

43 a. Homeless. A person is considered homeless who lacks a fixed, regular, and adequate night-
44 time residence or has a primary night time residency that is: (A) a supervised publicly or
45 privately operated shelter designed to provide temporary living accommodations, (B) an
46 institution that provides a temporary residence for individuals intended to be
47 institutionalized, or (C) a public or private place not designed for, or ordinarily used as, a
48 regular sleeping accommodation for human beings. This does not include an individual
49 imprisoned or otherwise detained pursuant to federal or state law. [Eff. 6/30/2008]

50 In addition, homeless clients are exempt from client copayments, the income verification
51 requirement, ~~and the verification of denied Medicaid benefits requirement~~ and providing
52 proof of residency when completing the CICP application. [Eff. 6/30/2008]

53 b. Transitional Housing. Transitional housing is designed to assist individuals in becoming self-
54 supporting, but not referenced in 8.904.E.2. Clients living in transitional housing must
55 provide a written statement from their counselor or program director asserting that they
56 are participating in a transitional housing program. [Eff. 6/30/2008]

57 In addition, transitional housing clients are exempt from the income verification ~~and~~
58 ~~verification of denied Medicaid benefits~~ requirements when completing the CICP
59 application. [Eff. 6/30/2008]

60 c. Residing with Others. Clients who have no permanent housing of their own and who are
61 temporarily living with a person who has no legal obligation to financially support the
62 client are considered residing with others. The individual allowing the client to reside with
63 him or her may be asked to provide a written statement confirming that the client is not
64 providing financial assistance to the household and that the living arrangement is not
65 intended to be permanent. [Eff. 6/30/2008]

66 ~~In addition, clients residing with others are exempt from the verification of denied~~
67 ~~Medicaid benefits requirement when completing the CICP application. [Eff. 6/30/2008]~~

68 d. Recipient of Colorado's Aid to the Needy Disabled financial assistance program. A client who
69 is eligible and enrolled to receive the monthly grant award from Colorado's Aid to the
70 Needy Disabled financial assistance program. [Eff. 6/30/2008]

71 In addition, recipients of Colorado's Aid to the Needy Disabled financial assistance
72 program are exempt from client copayments, ~~and~~ the income verification requirement ~~and~~
73 ~~the verification of denied Medicaid benefits requirement~~ when completing the CICP
