ACP

Address Confidentiality Program

Provides a substitute address and confidential mail forwarding service to survivors of domestic violence, sexual offenses and/or stalking.

All state and local government agencies must accept the substitute address as a participant's legal address.

Open to all Colorado residents (including State employees) who meet eligibility criteria.

Enrollment assistants are available throughout the state.

No cost or financial eligibility requirements.

Colorado State Employee Assistance Program


Confidential/cost-free counseling for all State employees.

Professional help with personal and workplace issues, such as stress, anxiety, depression, grief, drug/alcohol concerns, parenting, domestic violence, relationship/marital issues and suicidal thoughts.

Nine offices throughout the state.

Emergency financial assistance.

Referrals to community resources.
