Completed old business

- Approved minutes from February 20, 2013 meeting, T. Dunn moved, D. Boer second, no discussion, all aye to accept.

Committee Reports

Ben Greene/CAP-NCAP- Not much to report, National Steering Committee Technical Subcommittees combining back into one. Small business website loses coordinator.

Troy Dunn/CAP – State passed B-Corp as official filing for profit businesses.

Bong Kwon/CAP – Continues to serve as the President of the Korean Dry Cleaners Assn., mentioned June 20, 2013 D/C Trade show in New Orleans, New York looking at multi-solvent machines.

Derek Boer/CAP – Discussed the self-certification pilot conducted with public and private high school chemistry labs in a 12-county area. Forty-page guidance document available on-line. Self-cert combines multi-media focus using waste, health and school regs. Site visits included local health inspector and fire dept. if available. Serves as a model for proper removal of old chemical/hazardous waste from schools. Generator Assistance Program has been working on identifying how outdated medicine and other hazardous waste generated at Assisted Living and institutional hospice facilities are managed. A self-certification pilot project will be developed in the future to improve management of expired medication or hazardous materials from these types of facilities.

Elizabeth Sapio/SBO- Reported that the Annual Report was submitted to EPA. Discussed staff realignments and potential for opportunity to increase focus with SBAP.

Christine Hoefler/SBAP- Discussed Regulation No. 6 (state only New Source Performance Standard), and Reg. 3 (Permitting reg.) will affect all businesses. Possible change to limits of 25 tons/year of any pollutant before permitting is necessary. APENs would still be required. 6,400 sources may no longer need permits. The goal is to reduce the backlog of permits and focus on what is important to put in the permit to protect public health. APCD holding stakeholder meetings in preparation of a rulemaking hearing in August.

Joni Canterbury/SBAP – Discussed the Dry Cleaner Alternatives Trade Show. Presentations included remediation and transitioning to alternatives, promoting wet cleaning. Department introduced language in support of banning perc.
