Notice Of A Proposed Renewal Title V Operating Permit Warranting Public Comment

NOTICE is hereby given that an application to renew an Operating Permit has been submitted to the Colorado Air Pollution Control Division, 4300 Cherry Creek Drive South, Denver, Colorado 80246-1530, for the following source of air pollution:

Tri-State Generation and Transmission Assn., Inc. has applied to renew the Operating Permit for the Limon Generating Station in Lincoln County, CO. This facility is an electrical power generation facility. The modifications associated with this action are described as follows - the permanent AOS language was removed, the Acid Rain ADR was updated, the insignificant activities list was updated, and various language was updated and clarified throughout the permit. There are no emission changes associated with this action. A copy of the application, including supplemental information, the Division's analysis, and a draft of the Renewal Operating Permit 02OPLI253 have been filed with the Lincoln County Clerk's office. The Division has made a preliminary determination of approval of the application. Based on the information submitted by the applicant, the Division has prepared the draft renewal operating permit for approval. Any interested person may contact Rachel Frisz of the Division at 303-692-3262 to obtain additional information. Any interested person may submit written comments to the Division concerning 1) the sufficiency of the preliminary analysis, 2) whether the permit application should be approved or denied, 3) the ability of the proposed activity to comply with applicable requirements, 4) the air quality impacts of, alternatives to, and control technology required on the source or modification, and 5) any other appropriate air quality considerations. Any interested person may submit a written request to the Division for a public comment hearing before the Colorado Air Quality Control Commission (*Commission*) to receive comments regarding the concerns listed above as well as the sufficiency of the preliminary analysis and whether the Division should approve or deny the permit application. If requested, the hearing will be held before the Commission within 60 days of its receipt of the request for a hearing unless a longer time period is agreed upon by the Division and the applicant. The hearing request must: 1) identify the individual or group requesting the hearing, 2) state his or her address and phone number, and 3) state the reason(s) for the request, the manner in which the person is affected by the proceedings, and an explanation of why the person's interests are not already adequately represented. The Division will receive and consider the written public comments and requests for any hearing for thirty calendar days after the date of this Notice.
