



Enabling Breadcrumbs without Including the Page or Webform in the Top Navigation

Pacific automatically includes breadcrumbs at the top of pages included in the top navigation menu, but MSAs can also add breadcrumbs to pages that do not appear in the top navigation.

Step 1: Include the Page or Webform in the Top Navigation

Navigate to or create the page or webform that will eventually have breadcrumbs but not appear in the top navigation. In the edit screen, check the *Provide a menu link* box in the *Menu settings* tab. Save or Publish the page or webform.

Step 2: Navigate to the Menus Page and Click *List Links*



Step 3: Nest Your Page or Webform in the Correct Place


Click and drag using the arrows. Make sure your node is in the correct location.

In this example, the webform called *Request a Visit* will have breadcrumbs leading back to the *Contact Us* page.



Step 4: Uncheck the Enabled Menu

On the right side of the table, uncheck the *ENABLED* check box that corresponds with your page or webform. Click the *Save configuration* button.



NOTE: Nodes that are disabled will not appear in left navigation menus.

You're Done!

As you can see in the image below, the *Request a Visit* webform has breadcrumbs leading back to the *Contact Us* page. However, there is not a *Request a Visit* item in the top navigation menu.
