Denver Water seeks new Citizens Advisory Committee members

Sept. 8, 2014:

Denver Water's [Citizens Advisory Committee](#), the 10-member volunteer committee that facilitates public involvement for Denver Water policies and programs, is seeking three new members. The CAC has openings for two citizen representatives from the City and County of Denver and **one representative from a Public Interest Group.**

The CAC typically meets the third Thursday of each month, 5–7 p.m., in the Board Room at Denver Water, 1600 W. 12th Ave., Denver, CO 80204.

To qualify for the Denver representative, applicants must reside within the city limits of Denver and be a customer of Denver Water. **To qualify for the public interest position, an applicant can live either inside or outside Denver, but must be supplied with water through Denver Water — either directly or through a suburban water distributor. All applicants must be U.S. citizens and have been Colorado residents for at least five years. All positions are three-year terms that start January 2015 and go through December 2017.**

The CAC will interview selected candidates via phone or in person on Thursday, Nov. 20. Following the interview, the committee will send two nominations for each position to the Denver Board of Water Commissioners for final selection.
