What is Child Health Plan *Plus* (CHP+)?

Child Health Plan Plus (CHP+) is public low-cost health insurance for children and pregnant women. If you earn too much to qualify for Health First Colorado (Colorado's Medicaid Program), but not enough to pay for private health insurance, you may qualify for CHP+. CHP+ covers doctor visits, emergency care, preventive care such as screenings and immunizations, and other procedures and treatments. CHP+ can help you and your family get healthy and stay healthy.

Who qualifies?

- Colorado children age 18 and under and pregnant women
- Individuals with a household income less than about \$30,000 a year, or a family of four that makes less than about \$63,000. If your household earns more, you may still qualify.
- Lawfully residing children and pregnant women.
- Children and pregnant women who do not have other health insurance or qualify for Health First Colorado (Colorado's Medicaid Program)

- **Apply In Person:** Apply at your County Department of Human or Social Services Office or an application assistance site. Find a location near you at CO.gov/HCPF/CHPPlus.
- **Apply by Mail:** Fill out a paper application. You can mail it in or drop it off at your local County Human or Social Services Office or an application assistance site.

How much does it cost?

CHP+ costs vary on your household size and income. CHP+ members may have to pay an annual enrollment fee. This fee is due within 30 days after you qualify for CHP+. If your enrollment fee is not paid then you will be denied CHP+, and you will need to re-apply.

Some CHP+ members pay as little as \$25 a year, or nothing at all. CHP+ members may also have to pay co-payments to their health care provider at the time of their appointment or service. Pregnant women, American Indians and Alaskan Natives do not have to pay annual enrollment fees or co-payments.
