If You're Pregnant You're Eligible for Child Health Plan *Plus* (CHP+)!

CHP+ is public low-cost health insurance for certain children and pregnant women. CHP+ covers doctor visits, emergency care, preventive care such as screenings and immunizations, and other procedures and treatments. CHP+ can help you get healthy and stay healthy.

Now that you qualify, there are a few important steps you need to take.

- 1 Pregnant women do not need to pick a health plan.** You are enrolled in the State Managed Care Network right away if you are pregnant. You can find a provider at [CO.gov/HCPF/CHPPlus](https://www.co.gov/HCPF/CHPPlus) or by calling 303-839-2120 or 1-888-367-6557.
- 2 Pick your provider.** After you pick your child's health plan, you will need to pick their provider. Call your health plan to pick your child's provider.
- 3 Schedule a check-up.** Schedule a well-child visit for your child. Even if you or your child are not sick, it is important to get to know your provider.

Frequently Asked Questions

Q What does it cost?

A Pregnant women do not have to pay an enrollment-fee or co-pays.


Q Where can I get more information?

Q How long am I covered after my baby is born?

A 60 days after your baby is born. Call CHP+ Customer Service at 1-800-359-1991 to find out about coverage for you and your baby.


