ACTION ITEMS

Spark: Prompt CLQIC members to outreach to potential committee members; Integrate feedback received from the work plan activity; Coordinate June meeting and NCI presentation with HCPF

CLQIC members: Fill-out bucket worksheets to provide guidance on CLQIC's direction

MEMBERSHIP

There is a need to increase CLQIC membership particularly consumer membership and representatives from the institutional care side.

An Ombudsman representative potentially could serve as a member. The state long-term care Ombudsman, Medicare, and Medicaid advocacy program are all housed within the Disability Law Colorado Office.

PIAC Update

What has not been a part of PIAC until the introduction of CLQIC's recommendations is how to blend the social model with the medical. There are all the social determinants of health issues that form 1500 fails to measure. CLQIC recommendations brought PIAC different data sets and quality issues to support the LTSS population.

PIAC indicated that they would like an LTSS representative to sit on the PIAC Committee and other CLQIC members to sit on subcommittees where the real work will occur.



NATIONAL QUALITY FORUM TRAINING (see PPT and recording)

CLQIC has an opportunity to work on a Colorado-specific framework, but the national frameworks provide us with the basics therefore we introduced what is occurring around quality at a National level.

WORK PLAN DEVELOPMENT

Survey Map (view survey cross-walk here)

Introduced the survey map/ cross-walk outlining all of HCPF's surveys from which data can be drawn and analyzed.

A strong role would be to advise HCPF on what we really need from the survey and if all of the surveys must stay in existence or if there is duplication.

Work Plan Activity

The committee split into groups of 2-3 to brainstorm on the work CLQIC could do within four buckets of HCPF work to provide feedback for Spark to begin thinking through a CLQIC work plan.

Moving forward CLQIC will develop more context around specific buckets of work in small groups and then move into a big group exercise.
