


CORRIDOR OF HONOR MILITARY MEMORIAL

Here, the Star of the Memorial Plaza is poured, with the service seals at each point of the star while the great seal of the U.S. is placed in the center.






Waiting for warmer weather, the star plaza and the surrounding ground that circles the star gets a blanket to protect the new concrete work.



CORRIDOR OF HONOR MILITARY MEMORIAL STAR PLAZA WAITING FOR EARLY SPRING

Fellow Veterans, Family, and Friends of Veterans.

The Corridor of Honor Military Memorial will be a wonderful place where friends and family who reside along the I-70 corridor can reflect on Veterans' service and sacrifice, a peaceful setting to express respect to the veterans in their lives. We offer this brief update on the Corridor of Honor Military Memorial.

The Number One (1) Memorial Brick Panel is back from CW Elaborations, Denver CO, and is in temp storage at the Town of Bennett, Muegge Quonset Building (Near Civic Center Park & Memorial Site). The fabrication by *J & R Bennett Welding Inc*, sandblasting by Roadrunner Fabrication (Denver) and powder coating by C W Elaborations Inc (Denver) was all donated at a significant savings to our efforts.

The white marble stone which is the center piece of Kirsten Solberg's vision for a tribute to honor the veterans of our I-70 corridor and those of area families and friends is very close to completion. The marble stone, which is reduced in weight and size from the original quarry stone and can now be moved about by Erickson Monuments. This is a huge load off of the volunteers who have been working that aspect of the memorial effort. The application of a special "rubberized stencil", used in sandblasting of the inscription, of what will be the north side of the stone, will be completed very soon.

The movement of the stone to the memorial site from Denver will be accomplished as soon as Erickson Monuments' work is completed and weather cooperates with crews at both locations. We have secured a crane service to lift the stone on to the star which is the center of memorial plaza. Many thanks to Blaine Schmitt and John McNeil of Schmitt Reddi-Mix, LLC, Strasburg, CO for assisting us with this important issue.

The first order of bricks will be made in the next five to ten days, so please encourage those still working on their order forms, to get them sent in as soon as possible. We have sold 68 bricks so far and there are a few other orders expected very soon. The first panel will have 47 bricks, filling 60 ea 4"X8" spaces, the difference occurs when the bricks are a mix of 4"X 8" bricks and 8"X 8" bricks. The second panel is being fabricated and we will arrange for its' sandblasting and powder coating very soon. Clark's Equipment Sales / Rentals, (Bennett) has graciously, agreed to be our shipping point and temporary storage of the bricks until they can be moved closer to the memorial site. Our goal is of course to fill at least two brick wall panels before the dedication.

Funding efforts for the flag poles is a high priority, so if you know of any individual, business, or civic group that wants to donate towards the memorial, please help us connect with them. ANY monetary amount help will certainly help us reach our goal. For example, veterans of each branch of the military could band together and help raise money for their service flag pole/flag set. The Navy, Army, Merchant Marine flag pole/flag sets are fully funded, the Air Force Flag Pole funding has some support, but we really need help with the Marine Corp and Coast Guard flag pole/flag sets.

We have another goal to purchase additional benches and trash receptacles for the memorial plaza area. These must match the manufacture and model specifications we agreed to, last year during negotiations with the Town of Bennett and the project architect. We have secured bids on these items with the best price than we thought possible. We have been encouraged by the assistance that a number of businesses who have come alongside of us are providing that are making this a reality.

When we see the dream of Kirsten Solburg and what has become everyone's dream that is associated with the project, taking shape and becoming a reality, we get so much more satisfaction than a paycheck could ever provide. The memorial will truly be a place where the veterans of our communities and those of our individual lives can be honored for their sacrifice and service to this country. If anyone has heard Kirsten Solberg explain how this idea or dream of a memorial came to her, then you began to know her heart for veterans. You will have an opportunity to see and feel her dream for yourself on May 26, 2014, at 2 PM.

The agenda of the dedication will be announced in the next few weeks. Please set that time aside for a once in a life time event. Note: The morning of the 26th will be set aside for honoring our veterans as we have traditionally done at the Mountain View Cemetery.
