<sup>[1]</sup> Implementation of CMS on July 1, 2009 was in compliance with the statutory provisions noted herein. Many of the contracts held by State agencies as of that date were later amended or extended and some were Master agreements with individual task orders issued under their broad provisions. To facilitate a more complete contract history and complete information related to a contractor and its performance, many agencies elected to create a CMS record for the original agreement which was effective prior to the July 1, 2009 date. Previous years of data included these contracts as well, despite not being required under statute to be included in these legislative documents, as they are a part of the complete package leading up to vendor evaluation and rating.
