



CATEGORICAL EXCLUSION DETERMINATION
FOR THE PROPOSED DRINKING WATER PROJECT FOR
COLUMBINE LAKES WATER DISTRICT

The Water Quality Control Division of the Colorado Department of Public Health and Environment has conducted a review of the proposed drinking water project for the Columbine Lakes Water District in accordance with Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) and State of Colorado procedures for implementing the National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) (40 CFR Part 6) and the State of Colorado NEPA-like policy (SRF Operating Agreement). The State has determined that this project is eligible for a categorical exclusion. Accordingly, the State is exempting the project from further substantive environmental review requirements under the above stated policies.

Project Description:

The proposed project consists of replacing water lines, replacing and adding fire hydrants, and replacing and adding isolation valves. The project will be funded by a Drinking Water Revolving Fund loan in the amount of \$690,000 at an interest rate of 2%. The loan will not increase monthly user rates and the project, by design, will not increase the drinking water for the planning area.

Criteria for Granting a Categorical Exclusion under 40 CFR part 6.204:

The action proposed will ensure compliance with current and future drinking water treatment standards. The following criteria condition the allowance of the categorical exclusion for the proposed action:

- Functional replacement of equipment;
- Minor upgrades and expansions of existing water systems in communities of 10,000 population or less (distribution line extensions are not included.)
