The Department of Health Care Policy and Financing (Department) wanted to let you know that we released a Concept Paper for the Accountable Care Collaborative (ACC) Phase II later today. You can access the Concept Paper at <https://www.colorado.gov/pacific/hcpf/regional-care-collaborative-organizations-rccos-request-proposals-rfp>.

We developed the Concept Paper to describe our vision regarding the program design and goals for the next iteration of the ACC. It is meant to serve as a request for our federal, state, and local partners to collaborate with us as we work towards building a more integrated health system that can improve the health of low-income and underserved Coloradans in an innovative and cost-efficient manner. As a vision statement, we fully realize that some components of the Concept Paper might not be feasible or desirable following guidance from the Centers for Medicare & Medicaid Services and stakeholders. This Concept Paper is just the starting point for concrete and productive conversations.

In order to facilitate dialogue and collaboration, the Department has scheduled a number of public meetings to discuss specific topics as they relate to ACC Phase II (see the attached document). Additional sessions will be announced at a later date that will explicitly address the areas of behavioral health and long term services and supports.

Greetings.

The Colorado Department of Transportation Division of Transit & Rail is pleased to offer the following Notice of Funding Availability.

DTR is offering eligible entities the opportunity to request funding for the development of Local and Regional Coordinating Councils. There is \$100,000 available in this pot of funding for 2016. Funding will only be provided to one of the following:

1. Any entity interested in facilitating the creation and development of a Local or Regional Coordinating Council in an area where such an organization does not currently exist, or;
2. An existing grant partner who received funding in 2015 for the purpose identified above to conclude the planning and development efforts needed for the establishment of a permanent Local or Regional Coordinating Council

Please note, this funding is only available for a maximum of two (2) years and must result in the creation of an action plan that establishes the Local or Regional Coordinating Council and identifies the champion agency that will act as the Council's host agency. Host agencies are then encouraged to seek funding under FTA 5310 or 5311 programs which may be made available in April, 2016.
