







A "yes/for" vote on any ballot question is a vote in favor of changing current law or existing circumstances, and a "no/against" vote on any ballot question is a vote against changing current law or existing circumstances.

<p><b>Proposition EE (STATUTORY)</b></p> <p>SHALL STATE TAXES BE INCREASED BY \$294,000,000 ANNUALLY BY IMPOSING A TAX ON NICOTINE LIQUIDS USED IN E-CIGARETTES AND OTHER VAPING PRODUCTS THAT IS EQUAL TO THE TOTAL STATE TAX ON TOBACCO PRODUCTS WHEN FULLY PHASED IN, INCREMENTALLY INCREASING THE TOBACCO PRODUCTS TAX BY UP TO 22% OF THE MANUFACTURERS LIST PRICE, INCREMENTALLY INCREASING THE CIGARETTE TAX BY UP TO 9 CENTS PER CIGARETTE, EXPANDING THE EXISTING CIGARETTE AND TOBACCO TAXES TO APPLY TO SALES TO CONSUMERS FROM OUTSIDE OF THE STATE, ESTABLISHING A MINIMUM TAX FOR MOIST SNUFF TOBACCO PRODUCTS, CREATING AN INVENTORY TAX THAT APPLIES FOR FUTURE CIGARETTE TAX INCREASES, AND INITIALLY USING THE TAX REVENUE PRIMARILY FOR PUBLIC SCHOOL FUNDING TO HELP OFFSET REVENUE THAT HAS BEEN LOST AS A RESULT OF THE ECONOMIC IMPACTS RELATED TO COVID-19 AND THEN FOR PROGRAMS THAT REDUCE THE USE OF TOBACCO AND NICOTINE PRODUCTS, ENHANCE THE VOLUNTARY COLORADO PRESCHOOL PROGRAM AND MAKE IT WIDELY AVAILABLE FOR FREE, AND MAINTAIN THE FUNDING FOR PROGRAMS THAT CURRENTLY RECEIVE REVENUE FROM TOBACCO TAXES, WITH THE STATE KEEPING AND SPENDING ALL OF THE NEW TAX REVENUE AS A VOTER-APPROVED REVENUE CHANGE?</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES/FOR    <input type="radio"/> NO/AGAINST</p>	<p><b>Proposition 118 (STATUTORY)</b></p> <p>Shall there be a change to the Colorado Revised Statutes concerning the creation of a paid family and medical leave program in Colorado, and, in connection therewith, authorizing paid family and medical leave for a covered employee who has a serious health condition, is caring for a new child or for a family member with a serious health condition, or has a need for leave related to a family member's military deployment or for safe leave, establishing a maximum of 12 weeks of family and medical leave, with an additional 4 weeks for pregnancy or childbirth complications, with a cap on the weekly benefit amount; requiring job protection for and prohibiting retaliation against an employee who takes paid family and medical leave; allowing a local government to opt out of the program; permitting employees of such a local government and self-employed individuals to participate in the program; exempting employees who offer an approved private paid family and medical leave plan; to pay for the program, requiring a premium of 0.9% of each employee's wages, up to a cap, through December 31, 2024, and as set thereafter, up to 1.2% of each employee's wages, by the director of the division of family and medical leave insurance; authorizing an employer to deduct up to 50% of the premium amount from an employee's wages and requiring the employer to pay the remainder of the premium, with an exemption for employers with fewer than 10 employees; creating the division of family and medical leave insurance as an enterprise within the department of labor and employment to administer the program; and establishing an enforcement and appeals process for retaliation and denied claims?</p> <p><input type="radio"/> YES/FOR    <input type="radio"/> NO/AGAINST</p>	<p><b>City of Craig Ballot Question 2D</b></p> <p>Shall the Home Rule Charter of the City of Craig be amended concerning residency requirement for the municipal judge to read in its entirety as follows:</p> <p>Article IV, Section 1. - Municipal Court.</p> <p>*There shall be Municipal Court vested with jurisdiction of all causes arising under the Charter and the ordinances of the City of violation or enforcement thereof with the exception of those offenses which are handled by administrative hearing procedures as provided by ordinance. The Judge of the Court shall be a licensed attorney in the State of Colorado. The Judge shall be a resident of the City of Craig or Moffat County. The Judge shall meet this residency requirement within six (6) months of commencement of his or her employment. He or she shall be appointed by a majority of the entire Council for a term of two (2) years and shall receive such compensation and other terms of employment as shall be fixed by the Council. Such compensation shall in no manner be contingent upon the amount of fees charged or collected as a result of Court action. In his or her absence, the Council shall designate a reputable person possessing the qualifications for the office to serve in his or her stead. The Municipal Judge may be removed for cause by a majority of the entire Council. Mayor.</p> <p>*The Mayor shall be elected at each regular municipal general election from the City at large in the manner provided in Article VI for a term of two (2) years or until his successor has been elected and qualified. The Mayor shall be a voting member of the City Council and shall preside at meetings of the Council and shall be recognized as the head of the Government for all ceremonial purposes and by the Governor of the State for purposes of military law. The Mayor shall execute and authenticate legal instruments requiring his or her signature as such official. The Mayor shall present a State of the City message on an annual basis. The Mayor shall receive actual and necessary expenses incurred in the performance of their duties of office as provided in the travel policies of the City. The Council shall elect an Assistant Mayor who shall act as Mayor during the absence or disability of the Mayor and who, if a vacancy occurs (as outlined in Section 6), shall become Mayor for the unexpired term. In addition, a Council member shall forfeit his/her office upon failure to attend three (3) consecutive regular meetings of the City Council without being excused by the City Council. In case of a vacancy, the remaining Council members shall choose by a majority vote, within ninety (90) days after such vacancy occurs, a person qualified under Article II, Section 2, of this Charter to fill such vacancy. In the event of a tie vote the Mayor shall solely select the appropriate nominee to fill the vacant seat. If such vacancy occurs during the first two (2) years of the of a term, the person appointed by City Council shall serve only until the next municipal general election, at which time the seat shall be filled by election for a two (2) year term. If such vacancy occurs in the last two years of a term, the person appointed by City Council shall serve the remainder of the vacated term. If three (3) or more vacancies exist simultaneously, the Council may, by ordinance, establish a two-year term prior to the general election to the Council member who received the least amount of votes. City Attorney Qualifications.</p> <p>*The City Attorney shall be selected on the basis of legal qualifications and experience and must be an attorney licensed in the State of Colorado for a minimum of three (3) consecutive years. The City Attorney shall be a resident of the City of Craig or reside within Moffat County. The City Attorney shall meet this residency requirement within six (6) months of commencement of his or her employment. In the event there is not a qualified local candidate to fulfill the role of City Attorney, Council may elect to utilize the services of an out of town attorney for a period of up to twelve (12) months under Article V, Section 3. The powers and duties of the City Attorney shall be prescribed by ordinance. The City Manager shall be selected solely by the Council on the basis of executive and administrative training, education, experience and ability. The City Manager shall be a resident of the City of Craig or reside no further than 10 miles from the City and within Moffat County. The City Manager shall meet this residency requirement within six months of commencement of his or her employment.
