

This jurisdictional plan is comprised of the Colorado Comprehensive HIV Testing Plan (CCHTP), the 2012 Comprehensive HIV Prevention Plan funded by the Center for Disease Control (CDC) and a summary of the Colorado HIV/AIDS Prevention Program (CHAPP) funded by the State. These documents are complementary to provide a complete overview of the publicly funded HIV prevention efforts in the jurisdiction. The CCHTP addresses the changes in HIV testing approach based a “Test and Treat Strategy” informed by the epidemiology of HIV in Colorado. The CCHTP was facilitated and drafted by the John Snow International Inc.; based on the recommendations of an HIV expert panel, the review and feedback of the HIV advisory committees as well as a broad-base stakeholder outreach.

The 2012 Comprehensive HIV Prevention Plan is part of the “High Impact HIV Prevention” agenda promoted by the CDC that covers the state’s goals and objectives relative to:

- Prevention initiatives with HIV positive and HIV negative persons with respect to risk groups;
- The Colorado condom distribution program;
- A policy initiative to advance sexual health in Colorado schools;
- The proposed capacity building efforts with community partners; and
- The monitoring and evaluation plan of the proposed prevention program.

The CHAPP summary included is to provide a complete picture for the geographical and programmatic interventions to prevent HIV in Colorado in 2012. The CHAPP interventions are prioritized by the CHAPP Advisory Committee and approved by the Colorado Board of Health.

The 2012 jurisdictional plan is a dynamic document that will be revised periodically in accordance with programmatic outcomes in collaboration between the CDPHE and the community partners.
