

Q: Can you provide examples of projects that fall within these guidelines?

A: Any projects that save water, promote reuse or prevent/reduce water pollution will be considered. Possible examples include things like water reuse demonstration projects, water-saving plumbing fixtures or toilets, projects that reduce the need for toxic chemicals, and xeriscaping demonstration areas, to name a few. I encourage you to review the evaluation criteria and make sure your application speaks to those as much as possible.

Q. The project description can't all be seen in the space provided in the form so the reader must scroll through it. For printing and ease of review, can I submit a Word version of the application, which follows the application consistently, rather than the form pdf version that is posted?

A. Given the limitations of the form, feel free to include a Word version of the project description with your application form but please keep it to a page or less. Note: a Word version of the project funding application has been posted online.

Q: The project covers the period from 1/16/2017 to 6/30/2017, so just six months, is that correct?

A. That's correct. This round is unusually short. We're expecting to issue another RFA in the spring that will be for July 1, 2017 - June 30, 2018.

Q. If we apply for these funds, can we apply for future PPAB funds?

A. Yes.

Q. Would seminars be eligible for sponsorship from the PPAB or would these be better suited for the grant program?

A. If an organization will be hosting events that will offer information only, please apply for an event sponsorship. However, if the events will also provide tools or resources for implementation of projects and will result in measurable benefits apply for the project grant.
