Colorado Cottage Foods

Foods that can be sold under the Act

Since the enactment of the Colorado Cottage Foods Act, the division has received inquiries regarding specific foods and whether they can be sold under the law. The list below is a sample of the types of foods that can be sold under the act. The list below is not all-inclusive, so if you still have inquiries regarding specific foods which you do not see on the list, please contact the local public health department in your area with any inquiries. - Certain Baked Goods
- Confections with Alcohol intended as candy.
- Cotton Candy (prepackaged)
- Dehydrated Produce
- Dry Cake Mix
- Fruit Butter
- Granola Bars
- Jams, Jellies and Preserves
- Honey
- Nuts
- Roasted Coffee Beans
- Roasted Nuts
- Roasted Seeds
- Seeds
- Spices
- Teas
- Whole Eggs

At this time, we have decided to NOT include a list of disallowed foods. If a food product does not fit the type listed above, it's likely disallowed from this act. Contact your local public health agency for additional information.
